SHARED STORIES: THE TIES THAT BIND

Weekend Wedding

Many people tie the knot in Las Vegas, but not all marriages last as long as that of Evelyn Watson. Las Vegas was a smaller town when Dwight and Evelyn made the trip in his '49 Chevy, but even then it was a place where "people never seemed to sleep." Shared Stories is a weekly column featuring articles by participants in a writing class at the Norwalk Senior Center. We were 19 the year following our graduation. I was working at the phone company, renting a very small bungalow in Bellflower, and Dwight was working and living at home with his parents in Bellflower. When we decided to marry, my mother objected to us marrying in the church that Dwight attended. We then decided to go to Las Vegas.

 $Dwight's\,mother\,was\,dis appointed,$ but she prepared notarized papers of approval for Dwight to marry. Young men needed to be 21 to marry at that time in Las Vegas. Girls did need parental approval after age 18.

The first weekend I wasn't scheduled to work we drove across the desert alone in Dwight's '49 Chevy on a Friday night. It was miserably hot that July. Las Vegas during the fifties was very different than the Las Vegas of the present. On the strip entering Vegas, casinos were miles apart with nothing but desert in between.

One of the first casinos we came to was The Silver Slipper. Continuing down the strip we passed well-known places named The Flamingo, The Sands, The Dunes, The Sahara, The Tropicana, and The Stardust, all now historic hotels and casinos. Each had big-name entertainers listed on their marquees. Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Sammy Davis, Jr., and Debbie Reynolds were a few.

Fremont Street was the main drag of the town. Cars cruised up and down a crowded street with people hurrying back and forth at light signals to escape the heat and enter brightly lit casinos. Just like today, casinos never closed and people seemed to never sleep.

It was our first time to experience this world, and it was exciting. Rows of slot machines were in use, bells were ringing, and we heard the sound of change dropping as machines paid off. We watched from the sidewalk through open, air-conditioned curtains. Loitering was forbidden in gambling areas for anyone under 21. We were allowed to watch lounge shows in the casinos, and most of them had all-you-can-eat buffets where we could get a meal quite reasonably.

The courthouse was open Saturday morning for us to acquire our marriage license, and Dwight bought a ring with diamond chips at a jeweler's. We found the only room available at a cheap, rundown motel. After changing our clothes we went to the Chapel of the White Stars to be married without relatives or friends.

I wore a white sheath dress, a new dress I had not worn before. No pictures were taken. Only a weak recording of our vows with our marriage license remains. It was a Vegas style marriage ritual, not really a wedding, but it satisfied Nevada law for a legal marriage. I chose Dwight's legal name, Watson, over his stepfather's name, Dunkel, which he

had used in school. The heat was already bearing down on us Sunday morning as we started back to cross the desert without air-conditioning. It reached 114 degrees that day, causing the fuel pump to vapor-lock. It was a long wait for a new one to arrive at the garage we were fortunate to find on that empty desert road. Both of us were due back to work Monday morning.

That was the beginning of a new life together with more challenges and new experiences to come. Our shared life together of 56 years now includes four children and two grandchildren.

About the artists

Matviy Vaisberg (also Matvey Vaisberg) was born in Kyiv in 1958. He graduated from Taras and the Ukrainian Polygraphic "Road to Freedom" includes Institute specializing in book design.

Vaisberg is a founder of the "Ariergard" movement that developed its intellectual-aesthetics and early post-Soviet time. His works are part of the following permanent Audio recordings and genuine collections: Museum of Russian Art in Kyiv, Vilno Gaon Jewish Mu-seum, Vilnius, Lithuania, K. Weidlich and Eberkhardt Collection, Munich-Leipzig, Germany.

The artist lives and works in Kyiv. His paintings displayed in the exhibit are from his "The Wall" series, depicting the most dramatic days of the Maidan hostilities, which the artist witnessed in person. He spent almost every day and every night on the Maidan square for more than two months during the height of the protests.

Maxim Dondyuk, born in Ukraine in 1983, is a documentary photographer who began his work as a photojournalist in the Ukrainian since 2010, creating and promoting

Dondyuk's three documentary projects have been "Uman, Rosh Hashana" (2008-2012), "The Crimea Sich" (2010-2013), and "TB epidemic in Ukraine" (2010-2012). Today, he continues photographing events of the ongoing conflict in eastern Ukraine.

Olexander Glyadyelov, born in Poland in 1956, graduated from the Kyiv Polytechnical Institute. He studied photography independently through the mid 80's, and began working as a professional freelance photojournalist in 1989.

Glyadyelov covered the armed conflict in Moldova (where he was wounded), Nagornij Karabakh, and Chechnya. Since 1996, he has concentrated on long-term photographic documentary projects such as child abuse, the HIV/AIDS epidemic among intravenous drug users and post-Soviet prisons.

His photography been utilized by international organizations including MSF, WHO, UNAIDS, and UNICEF. He has held 30 personal photo exhibitions, and his awards include Grand-Prix of Ukrpressphoto-97, Hasselblad Prize at the European Photography competition in Vevey (Switzerland) in 1998, and the Mother-Jones 2001 Medal of Excellence, "Moving Walls 2002" OSI, in New York.

Igor Gaidai was born in Kharkiv, Ukraine, in 1961. He is a photographer, owner of a photo gallery, and author of three photo books - "The Ukrainians. Beginning of the Third Millenium" (1996-2003), "9 months + 3 days" (2006-2008), "Razom UA" (2004-2011).

Gaidai graduated cameraman from The Karpenko-Kary National University of Theatre, Cinema and Television in Kyiv in 1985, and later taught photography lighting and composition there. He is a founding member of the Union of Photo Artists of Ukraine.

He had worked as photographer for the Dovzhenko National Film Studio in Kyiv, and as a freelance photographer with leading advertising agencies for more than 15 years. In 1991, Gaidai founded his own private photo studio, the first in Ukraine. Since 1995 he has been the art director and co-owner of "Gaidai Studio." He focuses on creating and producing social-oriented photoobjects as well as promoting world photography in Ukraine, and Ukrainian photography in the West.


attending similar events in Los Angeles. "I've never heard of one in Downey before," said Letona, who is president of Ladies Leadership. "It could be the first in our community."

Rio Hondo College to offer bachelor's degree

• Whitter campus is one of 15 junior colleges permitted to begin offering 4-year degrees.

WHITTIER - Rio Hondo College on Tuesday was named as one of 15 California community colleges granted initial approval by the California Community Colleges Board of Governors to offer a fouryear degree as part of a historic statewide pilot program.

The program will undergo additional review by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office before the Board of Governors considers final approval in March.

Thirty-four campuses sought approval of degrees in the program, authorized by Senate Bill 850 as a way to train a new generation of graduates for high-demand technical jobs that increasingly require bachelor degrees.

Rio Hondo College has proposed creating a Bachelor of Science degree in Automotive Technology that would position students for jobs in the automotive field and comparable posts at sea and rail transit companies.

"We are proud and humbled to be considered among those helping to lead this innovative new educational program," said Teresa Superintendent/President Dreyfuss. "Our selection is a testament to the strength of Rio Hondo's programs, especially our Automotive Technology program."

Under SB 850, signed by Gov. Jerry Brown in early October, community colleges must launch 18 and sunset them by July 2023. Programs could be started as early as fall 2015, and the legislature and governor may renew the pilot effort after review.





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Dozens of Sinaloa Cartel members indicted in massive roundup

Mexico-based Sinaloa Cartel of multiple distribution cells - are 2014. charged in 14 indictments unsealed last week with trafficking huge quantities of methamphetamine, cocaine, heroin and marijuana to points around the United States.

The indictments mark the conclusion of the third phase of a three-year investigation that, in total, has resulted in charges against 117 people and has had a significant impact on the worldwide operations of the Sinaloa Cartel.

This investigation also offered one of the most comprehensive views to date of the inner workings of one of the world's most prolific, violent and powerful drug cartels. Cartel members and associates were targeted for three years in a massive probe involving multiple countries, scores of law enforcement agencies around the United States, a number of federal districts and over 200 courtauthorized wiretaps in this district alone.

It'll never be time for term limits

It didn't get much attention at the time, but the elections last November did more than give Republicans a majority in the U.S. Senate. Voters also added to the ranks of people on both sides of Capitol Hill who believe members of Congress should serve a limited number of terms.

I know a lot of people to whom this is good news. I know them, because I hear from them every time I speak at a public event that allows for a give-and-take with the audience. Americans are frustrated with the federal government as a whole and with Congress in particular, and are searching for a simple solution. The notion that the bums could be thrown out automatically has great appeal.

Yet as popular as the idea might be among the public at large, it has no traction on Capitol Hill. The fundamental problem is that any measures imposing limits will need the support of leaders who, almost by definition, have served a long time. They're not going to put themselves out of a job they like. Small surprise that bills calling for term limits don't even make it

Now, I should say right up front that you're not going to hear a strong argument in favor of term limits from a guy who served 34 years in Congress. I'm biased. But I want to spell out the reasons for my bias, not because I think term limits are a burning issue in Washington — they're not but because I wish they were less of an issue for ordinary voters.

Congress has a lot of problems right now, and the American people have a role to play in fixing them, but term limits are a distraction from the truly hard work that needs to be done.

When you boil down all the debating points for and against term limits, there are two that bear the crux of the argument. The first has to do with the nature of our democracy. Supporters of the idea believe that bringing in fresh thinking and new leaders on a regular basis will make Congress more representative. However, stripping voters of the right to re-elect a representative whom they've supported in the past does not make for a

Representative government rests on the notion that voters get to choose their legislators. Telling them that this is true for all candidates but one the incumbent — does not strengthen voters' rights; it reduces their choices.

It also weakens Congress. And that's the other key issue.

The most important point to remember in all this is that if you take power away from a senior legislator, that power does not evaporate. Instead, it flows to the bureaucracy and the President. Serving productively in Congress is a tough, exacting task. It demands a deep knowledge of the issues that confront the country; a keen eye — backed by years of experience — for the ways in which executive agencies can go off track and then seek to hide that fact; insight into the ways in which both allies and opponents on any given issue might be motivated to shift their positions; and the hardearned wisdom to forge common ground among competing interests and ideologies.

These traits come neither quickly nor easily. Kicking members of Congress out of their seats just as they're gaining the ability to legislate effectively and oversee the government responsibly demotes Congress to the status of a minor agency. A politician elected to a limited term immediately begins looking for another job, which reduces his or her effectiveness and attention to the job at hand.

Moreover, in government, information is power. Legislators constantly come up against executive branch expertise backed by thousands of employees and big budgets. Legislators without expertise are at a strong disadvantage.

Term limits are not the solution to the real dysfunction that besets Washington. They reduce the choices of voters and accelerate the accumulation of power in the executive branch. They move representative democracy in the wrong direction.

Unfortunately, it seems the two words — consideration and responsibility aren't in some people's vocabulary. Wouldn't it be a much better society if they were?



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
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Paging Dr. Frischer...

I recently had a request to write a column on cysts. My first thought was that there is no way that an article on cysts could possibly be interesting for my readers. My second thought was the same as my first thought! However, several times each day, I review x-ray results and tell people that they have cysts. Without fail, I'm asked what a cyst is. So here is my chance to address this "highly fascinating" subject, and I can only promise to do my best!

A cyst is not a normal part of the body. It has a membrane or wall, and is usually filled with some kind of a material (liquid, semisolid, or gaseous). If it is filled with pus, it is usually not a cyst, but an abscess.

There are hundreds of different kinds of cysts. They can occur almost anywhere in the body, and vary in size. The vast majority have no symptoms and are benign, but occasionally one may contain malignant cells and would therefore be considered

(found in a joint), breast cysts, ovarian cysts, Baker cysts (found behind the liver cysts and kidney cysts.

Some cysts are easily felt under the skin as a lump or a bump, for developing one include genetic especially if they are located in the conditions, skin or in organs that are just under the skin, like the thyroid gland. For example, many of us are familiar with the sebaceous cyst, found just under flow of fluids. Still, there is no good the skin. It can become infected and

The treatment for a cyst depends on its underlying cause, and whether or not it is causing problems. Cysts that are found deeper in internal organs may be benign, small, and not produce any symptoms. A ganglion cyst in a knuckle or wrist can remain, unchanged, for years. These cysts may not require any treatment. However, if the cysts become large they can displace or compress tissue or an organ, or obstruct ducts and block normal flows of fluid. The affected organ may show symptoms.

and MRIs help to locate and identify a cyst. A needle biopsy might be used to reduce the size of the cyst, and to determine whether the cyst has malignant cells. A breast cyst can often treated by simply aspirating the cyst with a needle or catheter, causing the cyst to collapse. Other cysts may

cancerous. Some of the more common require removal by surgery, especially cysts include sebaceous cysts (found if there's any suspicion of malignancy. just under the skin), ganglion cysts Squeezing or popping a cyst on your own can actually make matters worse; if for example, the cyst is in a joint, knees), testicular cysts, thyroid cysts, popping it risks infection and possible joint damage.

> Who gets cysts? Risk factors chronic tumors, inflammation, duct blockage, parasites, injuries, organ defects, infections, and obstructions to the way to prevent cysts. Science really has no idea why some bodies make cysts, and others do not!

> What is the prognosis for a cyst? The vast majority are small and benign. These don't require treatment and have a good prognosis. Some benign but large or painful cysts may require surgery or aspiration to reduce or eliminate symptoms. Cysts become a problem if they become infected or contain malignant cancer cells, or are located in dangerous places like the

If one day your doctor informs you that you have a cyst, I hope that Ultrasound, X-ray, CAT scans, this column will have given you some measure of relief that it is very likely nothing to worry about.

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

Garcia says that California, where 38% of the population is Latino, should include this instruction just as schools have included curriculum on the Holocaust, Japanese Internment and histories on other violations of human rights that have occurred.





On Thursday, Congresswoman Lucille Roybal-Allard (CA-40) held a meeting at the Energy Resource Center in Downey with a group of the 40th Congressional District's city council members and city managers. She called the meeting so that the participants could exchange ideas about how to increase civic engagement and voter turnout in local communities.

"I'm deeply concerned about the lack of civic participation in our district three great-granddaughters, Isabella Marie, Summerlynn Rose and Gioia Mia. and across the country," said Roybal-Allard. "In last year's midterm elections, nationwide voter turnout was at its lowest level since World War II. We must educate voting-eligible individuals about why their vote counts, and the consequences their failure to vote can have on our government and our democracy. We can organize voter education forums, meetings with community groups, and discussions with high school students to spread the word about the importance of civic participation, including the power of the vote. I hope my fellow local political leaders will join me in this important work."





Norwalk school district starts planning bond spending

NORWALK - The Board of Education, during a study session on Jan. 15, directed staff to prepare three to four proposals that package potential projects with the District's first Measure G bond issuance this summer, which will range between \$52 million and \$70 million.

The public meeting provided board members with an overview of the District's \$600 million Facilities Master Plan, a long-range planning tool outlining facilities needs, the required next steps in regard to state laws, bond financing and a list of potential first projects. Staff will provide the detailed proposals at a public study session Feb. 2.

"The Facilities Master Plan was never meant to prioritize projects, but to simply provide insight into our needs for updating, renovating and revitalizing our facilities," said NLMUSD Interim Superintendent Ginger Shattuck. "When we return for the study session next month, we'll provide potential options and plans for the first round of projects. The Board of Education will make the ultimate decision on what happens next."

Voters approved Measure G in November so NLMUSD could renovate, repair and update its schools.

During the Jan. 15 meeting, District staff presented a list of potential first projects that included: security fencing; roof replacement; playfield/ playground upgrades; air conditioning systems in school offices and multipurpose buildings; furniture replacement; drought-resistant landscaping; lunch shelters; and digital marquees.

In addition, staff members presented options for construction of high school stadiums and performance/media centers.

Board members asked staff to return with proposals that cluster projects according to the following: projects that will fit within the funding scope for the first issuance; projects that are needed most; projects that logically should happen first to set up for future projects; projects requested by the community and staff; and projects related to technology.

'There are a lot of needs in terms of renovation and new construction at our schools and sites across the District," said NLMUSD Board of Education President Jesse Urquidi. "Now comes the challenging task of deciding what happens first. At the end of the day, it's our priority to ensure that we get the most for every dollar so that we can provide students with learning environments that are safe and engaging."

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
