CRIME REPORT

THURSDAY, SEPT. 17

At around 6:30 p.m., Downey Police Officers responded to Griffiths Middle School and contacted a man who was attempting to get into several classrooms and onto the roof of the school. At the conclusion of their investigation, the officers placed the subject under arrest for drunk in public and he was booked at the Downey Police Station. The subject's vehicle was later found nearby crashed into a fence.

FRIDAY, SEPT. 18

Downey Police Officers responded to the 8600 block of Springer to assist a victim who found one of his stolen ATV's parked to the front of a residence. Officers found several other stolen vehicles at the location. The crime scene was later turned over to a regional task force for further investigation.

Three intoxicated adult females were arrested for being drunk in public. While still at the scene, a vehicle drove away from the bar and almost collided into a Downey police car. The male driver was found to be intoxicated and was arrested for drunk driving. He was booked at the Downey Police Station.

At around 4:00 a.m., a license plate reader notified Downey Police Officers of a stolen vehicle. Downey officers saw the vehicle, a Mercedes Benz, stopped on Firestone and Brookshire. Officers contacted the male driver, a 35-year-old South Gate resident, and arrested him for Grand Theft Auto.

At around 1:00 p.m., Downey Police Officers responded to the Kaiser Hospital in Downey to investigate a 15-year-old male being treated at the hospital for a superficial gunshot wound. The victim told officers he had been shot in the City of Bellflower. Los Angeles County Sheriff Deputies responded and took over the investigation.

Thieves targeting work trucks and vans

The Taskforce for Regional Auto Theft Prevention (TRAP) has noticed an increase in commercial work truck/van thefts throughout Los Angeles County.

These thefts typically involve Ford Econoline, Chevrolet Express, or GMC Savanna-type vans owned by various contractors. The vehicles are typically stolen for the contents inside.

TRAP would like to inform you of measures you can take to prevent these types of thefts:

- 1. Consider installing a G.P.S. or other anti-theft device
- 2. Install commercial grade locks on all of the doors
- 3. Complete a thorough inventory of all of the contents, in case the
- 4. Mark large pieces of equipment with unique identifiers so in case it is stolen, the equipment can be identified if recovered.
- 5. If your vehicle is stolen, call your local police agency as soon as possible to report the theft.
- 6. If possible, keep your commercial work vehicle secured in a well-lit area, in a garage, or behind a locked gate.

Elderly man falls victim to IRS phone scam

DOWNEY – Downey Police are warning the public to be cautious after an elderly Downey man was swindled out of \$30,000 last week.

The victim received a phone call at about 11:30 a.m. on Sept. 17 from a man who represented himself as an IRS agent. The scam artist claimed the victim owed \$30,000 in back taxes and would be arrested if the balance was

The victim made deposits into two different bank accounts. After making the deposits, he called the IRS and found that he had been scammed.

"This is just one of many schemes that have been employed by conspiring criminals," the police department said in a statement. "Although the ruse is common, it continues to be a lucrative one. The suspects often target the elderly and take advantage of their trusting nature.

"Whatever the scam, the public can avoid falling victim by using caution when dealing with unknown subjects calling via the telephone."

The police department offered the following tips:

Never give personal information to anyone over the phone, including bank account numbers, PINs, or Social Security numbers;

No government agency will ever ask for a money order, gift card or

If you are solicited by telephone, ask to be mailed information about the charity's purpose, goals and finances before making any donations;

Hang up the telephone on aggressive or harassing solicitors;

Don't give cash. Make checks out to the charitable organization, not the person asking for the donation. Never give your credit card to a solicitor;

Be wary of a solicitation that includes an offer to send a courier to your house to immediately pick up your donation.

Police release video of fatal shooting, hoping for leads

DOWNEY – The Downey Police Department has released surveillance video of a deadly April shooting in the hope of identifying the murder suspect.

Nineteen-year-old James Lieneke was shot and killed on April 19 just before 3 a.m. on Woodruff Avenue, south of Firestone Boulevard near the Downey Elks Lodge parking lot.

The short video, which Downey police acquired

from an adjacent business, shows the gunman pulling up alongside Lieneke and his two friends they walked northbound on Woodruff Avenue.



Jumping from a dark-colored sedan, the shooter confronts Lieneke one-on-one, engaging in a quick conversation before opening fire and speeding away southbound.

Police believe the murder suspect may have known Lieneke and that he was victim of a targeted attack, but in order to garner more leads Lieutenant Mark McDaniel said the public must see the footage.

"At this juncture of the investigation, we need the public's help," he said in a press conference last Thursday. "We need a friend or acquaintance to come forward. Give us a call, give us a tip and we can bring this person to justice."

Waiting patiently for closure to the case is Lieneke's mother, Vivian, who said the loss of her only child has devastated her family.

"It doesn't matter if you didn't care for him, you had no right to take him from us," she said. "He was all

Family members acknowledged that James Lieneke of Downey began pulling away earlier this year, but they do not know why someone would want him dead.

"They took someone who was special and important to us. He didn't even start living his life," said Yvonne Gonzalez, Lieneke's cousin. "Now his mother and father have to wake up everyday without their son."

Sergeant Kevin McCaster of the Downey Police Department combated criticisms last week that he should have released the video footage earlier.

"We did not want to release it prematurely," McCaster said. "We wanted to make sure we chased all leads. We felt like this was the perfect time to bring it out to the public to get further information."

McCaster described the murder suspect as a bald-headed white or Hispanic male, approximately 5 feet, 8 inches tall and 180 pounds. Witnesses say he was wearing a white shirt and jeans.

"He's out there enjoying his life, but James isn't here. James isn't here because of you," Gonzalez said. "You need to turn yourself in."

Film festival continues through this weekend

DOWNEY - The Glennfest Film Festival in Downey continues through this weekend to its closing night on Oct. 8 with 11 more films. All screenings are free to the public.

The Downey Civic Theatre is the venue for the Oct. 4 afternoon screening of the documentary "Landfill Harmonic." The combined program, celebrating music and art, includes a special art exhibit in the lobby and mezzanine.

Doors open at 2 p.m. and the screening begins at 3. Refreshments will be available.

"Landfill Harmonic" traces the remarkable story of the Recycled Orchestra of Cateura in Paraguay. All of the instruments for this youth orchestra were made from items salvaged from one of Latin America's biggest landfills.

In a slum overwhelmed with stories of drugs, crime, and destitution, a local music teacher and a self-taught craftsman work together to make instruments for the children to have something positive

This youth orchestra has been featured on "60 Minutes," National Public Radio, CNN, and in publications such as The New York Times and the Washington Post. Their documentary reflects the transformative power of music and

the resilience of the human spirit.

The art exhibit in the theatre lobby, "Dance and Movement," features the work of 25 local artists. The theme was inspired by the upcoming fall concert of the Downey Symphony Orchestra, which includes selections from the ballet "Swan Lake." The artwork will be on display for theatre patrons for three weeks.

This free event is sponsored by the Downey Arts Coalition, with a grant from the city, and the Glennfest

"We're excited about this familyfriendly program," says Andrew Wahlquist, president of DAC, "and proud to be the first recipient of the Downey Theatre financial aid initiative." The city grant program is designed to make the theatre accessible to non-profit arts groups

On Saturday, Oct. 3, the Epic Lounge on 2nd Street will feature the cult classic "Rocky Horror Picture Show." Since the movie's premiere over 40 years ago in Westwood, new generations continue to fall in love with the musical comedy horror film and come to the show dressed as their favorite characters. 



Schools receive \$560K in art grants

NORWALK - The Los Angeles County Arts Commission announces \$560,000 of musical instruments district wide. in grants to 31 school districts and one charter school network in LA County through the Advancement Grant Program.

Administered by LA County's arts education initiative, Arts for All, these grants are matched by school district funds and offer resources to advance high quality instruction in dance, media arts, music, theatre and visual arts.

Ranging from \$10,000 to \$20,800, 32 grants were given to districts in the Arts for All network to invest in developing long term, sustainable approaches for delivering arts instruction. This year's funds support artist residencies in 12 school districts, teacher professional development opportunities in 15 districts, and six districts will develop arts integration programs in their schools.

The Advancement Grant Program is funded by The Angell Foundation, The Boeing Company, California Community Foundation, The Carl and Roberta Deutsch Foundation, Colburn Foundation, The Dwight Stuart Youth Fund, Herb Alpert Foundation, Rosenthal Family Foundation, and The Sheri and Les Biller Family Foundation.



Known as Jack to family and friends, his lifelong passion for

After graduating from Fairfax High, Jack apprenticed as a carpenter and also built sets in Hollywood, putting himself through college by swinging a hammer. He graduated from U.C. He took great pride in his Navy service during WW II, where he was Division Officer for a carrier aircraft support unit in the Pacific Theater. After WWII, he joined the Naval Reserve and later retired at the rank of Lieutenant Commander.

In his civilian career, he worked for Peerless Pumps, North American Aviation supporting the Mercury, Gemini, and Apollo space exploration/moon landing programs, and other space program contractors. In an engineering career stretching over 41 years, he took the greatest satisfaction from his participation in the Apollo program, eventually retiring from Hughes Aircraft.

His love of mountain climbing took him on many peak climbs across the montane West, especially the Sierra Nevada and San Gabriel mountains. He was an active member of the Angeles Chapter of the Sierra Club, leading hikes in Griffith Park, and he treasured the friends made on shared backpacks and hikes into the mountains.

He leaves behind daughters Kathleen and Jeannine, son-in-law Robert, and two grandchildren. He was predeceased by infant son John A., wife Babette, son Jon, and sisters Ruth and Geneva. Remembrances can be made to the Wounded Warrior Project, and to the Sierra Club Outings program.

Our country's wasteful spending

floor Tuesday regarding his opposition to the FY2016 short-term continuing we want? No. But you know what we start out with? Our negotiating position budget resolution. During the speech, Sen. Paul highlighted the need for right now is we start out with we defund nothing. Congress to pass appropriations bills individually and in a timely manner:

Reminded of that line from "Cool-hand Luke," what we have here is a failure to legislate. What we have here is a failure to use our leverage, a failure to use the power of the purse. Conservatives across America are unhappy and rightly so. We were told that when we took over Congress, when Republicans were elected to Congress that things would be different. That if voters put us in charge, we would right the ship. We would stop the deficits. And here we are with another

What is a continuing resolution? It is a continuation of the deficit spending of the past. It is a continuation of the waste. It is a continuation of the duplication. What is a continuing resolution? It is a steaming pile of the same old same old. Let me be clear. A continuing resolution is not a good thing. It is more of the status quo. It is a warmed-over version of yesterday's failures. It is an abdication of Congressional authority. It is an abdication of Congressional power.

Let us at least be honest. With a continuing resolution, no waste will be cut. No spending will be cut. No regulations will be stopped. And the debt will continue to mount. We are told that we cannot win, that we need 60 votes to defund anything. But perhaps there is an alternate future where courage steps up and saves the day. All spending is set to expire automatically. This is the perfect time to turn the tables. To tell the other side that they will need 60 votes to affirmatively spend any money.

You see, it doesn't have to be 60 votes to stop things. All spending will expire, and only those programs for which we can get 60 votes should go forward. What would that mean? That would mean an elimination of waste, an elimination of duplication, an elimination of bad things that we spend money on. If we have the courage, we could use the Senate's supermajority rules to stop wasteful spending. If we had the courage, we could force the other side to come up with 60 votes to fund things like Planned Parenthood. The budget is loaded with nonsense and

Some will say our job is to govern, to preside. But to preside over what? To preside over a mountain of new debt to be the same as the other side? To continue to add debt after debt? Our debt will consume us if we continue to preside over the status quo. It is as if we're on the titanic and just simply reshuffling the chairs. A continuing resolution continues the spending of wasteful money.

I'll tell you of a few we spend money on - \$300,000 last year studying whether or not Japanese quail are more sexually promiscuous on cocaine. These things should never have money spent on but if you do a continuing resolution it will continue. We spent several hundred thousand dollars studying whether or not we can relieve stress in Vietnamese villagers by having them watch television reruns. I don't know about you but I don't want one penny of these dollars going

We spent \$800,000 in the last couple of years developing a televised cricket league for developing Afghanistan. Do you know how many people have a television in Afghanistan? One in 10,000 people. I don't care if they've all got TV's; it's ridiculous that our money -- which we don't have, we have to borrow it from China to send it to Afghanistan.

If you're passing a continuing resolution, you're agreeing to continue this nonsense. We spent \$150,000 last year on yoga classes for federal employees. So not only do we pay them nearly one and a half times as much as the private sector employees, we give them yoga classes. If you pass a continuing resolution, this goes on and on. Nothing will change. The status quo will continue, and we will continue to spend ourselves into oblivion. We spent \$250,000 last year inviting 24 kids from Pakistan to go to space camp in Alabama. We borrow money from China to send it to Pakistan. It's crazy. It's ridiculous. And it should stop.

We have the power to stop it. Congress has the power to spend money or not spend money, and yet we roll over and we say it must continue. We don't have the votes to stop it. Nonsense. The other side doesn't have the vote to continue the spending if we would stand up and challenge them. We spent a half milliondollars last year and the year before developing a menu for when we colonize Mars. We sent a bunch of college students to Hawaii to study this. \$5,000 apiece we paid them. They got two weeks all expenses paid in Hawaii. And you know what a bunch of college kids came up with for the menu for Mars? Pizza.

This is where your money is going. I could go on, hundreds and hundreds of comes in. programs. If we do not exert the power of the purse, this continues. We should attach to all of the spending bills, all 12 individual bills not glommed together; recommend that everybody in America call their Congressman and say we're the media said those would be riders on appropriations bills. Exactly. That's the and say enough is enough. Let the funding expire and make the other side come Police service power of the purse.

If you object to the President writing regulations without our authority, Congress should defund the regulations. Congress should instruct him on Obamacare, what we object to. Congress should instruct him that we don't want money spent on Planned Parenthood. Hundreds and hundreds of instructions should be written into every bill and passed and sent to them. Would we win all

U.S. Senator Rand Paul delivered the following remarks on the U.S. Senate of these battles? Do we have the power to win every battle and defund everything

Why don't we start out with the negotiating position that we defund everything that's objectionable, all the wasteful spending, all the duplicative spending, let's defund it all and if there has to be negotiation let's start from defunding it all and see where we get. But it would take courage because you have to let spending expire. If you're not willing to let the spending expire and start anew, you have no leverage.

The power of the purse is only there if you have courage. You must have the courage of conviction to say enough is enough, that the debt is a greater threat to us than letting spending expire. Now some will report on this speech and say, "oh, he wants to shut down government." No, I don't. I just want to exert the power of the purse, and that means spending must expire. But I'm all for renewing the spending, but let's only renew the spending that makes sense.

We have the power of the purse if we choose to exert it. Look at the mountain of debt. Look at the debt that continues to be added up. We have not been doing our job. The way we are supposed to spend money in Congress is 12 individual appropriations bills. They've passed out of committee. Why aren't they presented on the floor? The Democrats have filibustered the only one presented. Let's present every one of them and let the public know, let everyone in America know that it's Democrats filibustering the spend bills.

It's Democrats who desire to shut down government. It's Democrats who desire not to have any restrictions on where the money's spent. It's the Democrats who are saying we don't want to end wasteful spending. We don't want to end any spending. We don't want any controls over spending. We want to continue the status quo. But we should not be complicit with them.

We have allowed this to go on for too long. It threatens the very heart of the republic. It threatens our very foundations to continue to borrow \$1 million a minute. It's time that we stood up. It is time that we took a stand and said enough is enough. When's the last time we did it in the appropriate fashion? When is the last time Congress passed each of the individual appropriations bills with instructions on how to spend the money? It was 2005, a decade ago. It's been a

In the last decade we've added nearly \$10 trillion in new debt. Maybe it's time to take a stand. I for one have had enough. I've had enough. I'm not going to vote for a continuing resolution. A continuing resolution is simply a continuation of the mounting debt. I for one will not do it. A continuing resolution is retreat. It is announcing your defeat in advance. What we should do is take a stand. We should say to the other side in the Senate it requires a supermajority.

What does that mean? 60 votes to pass spending. What would happen? You would have spending that is controversial, like Planned Parenthood, would fall away. They can ask for private donations. Good luck on that. You wouldn't find things being funded that are controversial. What would happen is there would no longer be spending for wasteful and duplicative projects. We listed these a couple of years ago. I think we had \$7 billion worth of duplication. Did we fix it? No. Every year the President, even this President puts forward \$10 billion, \$15 billion, and \$20 billion worth of programs that could be eliminated. Do they get eliminated? No, because Congress is dysfunctional and we continue to pass continuing resolution, which means we do not exert the power of the purse.

Congress is a shadow of what it once was. Madison said that we would have coequal branches and that we would pit ambition against ambition. We no longer do that. Congress is a withering shadow. It's a shadow of what it once was. Congress has no power, exerts no power, and we walk and we live in the shadow of a presidency that is growing larger and larger and larger.

The President's not afraid. He says he's got his pen and his phone. So he is writing and creating law. One of the philosophers they look to is Montesquieu, and Montesquieu said when the Executive begins to legislate, a form of tyranny will ensue. That's what we've got now. We have Executive tyranny. Not just this President, though. It's been going on for a while. Probably for 100 years we've been allowing more and more power to accumulate in the hands of the presidency.

What we need is a bipartisan taking back of that power. We need Congress to stand up on its own two feet and say enough is enough. We are reclaiming the power of the purse and we are going to do whatever is necessary to get rid of the wasteful spending, the duplicative spending, and the offensive spending. Jeb Bush blows it on race

With just two words — "free stuff" — Bush managed to insult millions of black Americans, completely misread what motivates black people to vote, and falsely imply that African Americans are the predominant consumers of vital social services. First, the facts.

Bush's suggestion that African Americans vote for Democrats because of

handouts is flat-out wrong. Data from the Joint Center for Political and Economic Studies shows that black voters increasingly preferred the Democratic Party over the course of the 20th century as it stepped up its support for civil rights.

These days, more than 90 percent of African Americans vote for the Democratic Party's presidential candidates because they believe Democrats pay more attention to their concerns. Consider that in the two GOP debates, there was only one question about the "Black Lives Matter" movement. When they do comment on it, Republican politicians feel much more at home criticizing that movement against police brutality than supporting it.

Bush is also incorrect to suggest that African Americans want "free stuff" more than other Americans. A plurality of people on food stamps, for example, are white.

Moreover, government assistance programs exist because we've decided, as a country, to help our neediest fellow citizens. What Bush derides as "free stuff" — say, Medicaid, unemployment insurance, and school lunch subsidies — are a vital safety net for millions of the elderly, the poor, and children, regardless of race or ethnicity.

How sad that Bush, himself a Catholic, made his comments during the same week that Pope Francis was encouraging Americans to live up to their ideals and help the less fortunate.

Finally, Bush's crass comment is especially ironic coming from a third-generation oligarch whose life has been defined by privilege.

Bush himself is a big fan of freebies. The New York Times has reported that, during his father's 12 years in elected national office, Bush frequently sought (and obtained) favors for himself, his friends, and his business associates. Even now, about half of the money for Bush's presidential campaign is coming from the Bush family

And what about those corporate tax breaks, oil subsidies, and payouts to big agricultural companies Bush himself supports? Don't those things count as "free stuff" for some of the richest people in our country?

It's also the height of arrogance for Bush to imply that African Americans are strangers to "earned success." African Americans have been earning success for generations, despite the efforts of politicians like Bush — who purged Florida's rolls of minority voters and abolished affirmative action at state universities.

If nothing else, this controversy shows why his candidacy has yet to take off as expected. His campaign gaffes have served up endless fodder for reporters, pundits, and comics alike.

Sound familiar?

As you may recall, Mitt Romney helped doom his own presidential aspirations by writing off the "47 percent" of the American people he said would never vote Republican because they were "dependent upon government."

In Romney's view, they're people "who believe that they are victims, who believe the government has a responsibility to care for them, who believe that they are entitled to health care, to food, to housing, to you-name-it."

Sorry, Jeb. The last thing this country needs is another man of inherited wealth and power lecturing the rest of us about mooching.

Planned Parenthood

In regards to the Planned Parenthood controversy, I, for one, fully support Planned Parenthood and hope that it will not be defunded solely based on false information.

This past summer, videos were released about the supposed atrocities being performed at Planned Parenthood. To begin with, the videos were highly edited and created by an anti-abortion group. Animal rights advocates plan protest at Downey shelter

DOWNEY – More than 200 animal advocates and members of the public are expected to attend a protest led by Laura Jones, co-founder of All About the Animals, who made news over the last few months after exposing fecesfilled kennels at Downey Animal Care Center in late August.

The peaceful protest is scheduled to take place this Saturday, Oct. 3, at the Downey Animal Care Center, located at 11258 S. Garfield Avenue in Downey (not be confused with SEAACA).

Protestors are meeting at 11 a.m. in front of the center with the demonstration beginning at 11:30 a.m.

To show that they are urging the L.A. County shelters to clean up their act, protest organizers are requesting that the public bring poop scoopers, brooms, mops, etc. Participants are also encouraged to bring their shelter dogs along with "before" pictures of them in the shelter.

"The protest is our latest effort in our stand against the inhumane treatment, wrongful killing, neglect and unsanitary conditions that the animals are subjected to in the Government run LA County animal shelters," said Jones. "The shelters house homeless animals, but the public must be aware that even their own pets may be at risk if they escape out of their back yard and have the misfortune of ending up at an LA County shelter. They will very likely get sick in the shelter, and could very well get neglected and mistreated, never mind the fact that they have only around 50% chance of making it out of the shelter alive."

Jones points to the most recent example that took place on Sept. 20 when rescuer Krista Place discovered Baca, a 2-year-old Australian Shepherd, who was "extremely sick" at the Carson Animal Care Center.

Place said she found Baca panting heavily and throwing herself against the kennel walls. Despite reporting that Baca needed urgent medical attention to two separate animal control officers within the space of one hour and a half, Baca died without being seen by the vet, Place said.

The director of the Department of Animal Care and Control claimed in a recent report that the Department is "an industry leader in managing animal health".

In addition, a petition was received from the residents of the proposed district showing the necessary contact rate and level of support for the establishment of the district and overnight parking prohibition. Staff has also verified that the boundaries of the proposed residential preferential parking district represent a reasonably self-contained area and that the district and overnight parking prohibition will be effective in addressing the on-street overflow parking issue in this area.

As a rule, I don't usually get stressed over things, and especially something that I have no control over. I have gone to church since I was very young and been taught to have faith and trust in God. I think that is why I stay calm even during times of great stress.

I was married to my first husband Leo for twenty-seven years. We met at a street dance in Pueblo, Colorado. He lived on the farm where he grew up, twenty-eight miles south of Pueblo, but he worked at the Colorado Fuel and Iron Company. I worked at the Colorado State Unemployment Office, and also had a part-time job on Saturday morning working for the Texaco Company.

The town was having a street dance, and being young, I was curious, so my sister Dorothy and I went. Leo asked me to dance, but I told him that I didn't know how to dance and he could dance with Dorothy. He didn't want to dance with her. My answer didn't deter him.

I told Leo where I worked so he wanted to take me to lunch sometime. A few days later he came into the office and we made arrangements to go to lunch. We courted for about a year. Leo took me to my first movie, "My Friend Flika." I was twenty-two years old.

Leo and I were married in 1953 and moved to California shortly after the wedding. It was a good marriage and we had four children.

Leo worked several jobs before getting one at the A.J. Bayer Company in Vernon. He worked there for twentythree years. We lived in several different

Leo was ill for a long time, had lost both of his legs due to the hardening

the hospital. We didn't have very much income and I was working part-time three days a week as an instructional assistant at the elementary school near us. At that time I was also trying to get a better fulltime job.

South Gate. It was part of Superior Honey Company. They sold bees wax candles. I was on the order desk taking orders over the phone, answering questions for customers, typing up the phone orders and ones that came in the mail.

It was a full time job and paid better than the one at the school, but I was gone more and had to have someone take care of Leo part of the time. Besides all of this, my youngest daughter Leona was still in school and another daughter Lola was going to college. Leo passed away the day before Lola graduated, which added to the stress at that time.

A number of years later my second husband Roy was ill. By this time Superior Honey and Bee Industries had been sold to another company in Stockton, so I was without a job again but had taken tests and been hired by the Los Angeles County Office of Education. I was working for a school for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing and Handicapped children in Lawndale. I was driving from Bell Gardens to Lawndale to work. Roy became ill and I had some of the same stress problems again.

A few months after Roy passed away

of the arteries, and was in and out of a square dance class. I first turned them down because our church was against dancing. Also the class was on a Sunday afternoon and I went to church on Sunday evening. I didn't think I could get back in time for church.

After thinking about it for a while, I I did get one at Bee Industries in called them back and said that, "A woman is allowed to change her mind, isn't she? I told them I would like to try the square dancing, so I met them at their home in Norwalk and went with them.

> The class was already in progress and I had missed more than the number of lessons allowed. Also, being single, it was harder to get a partner to dance with. I stuck with it, though, and learned all of the calls and the dancing. I have been square dancing now for almost twentyfive years and I really enjoy it. It is good exercise, you meet a lot of nice people, and it keeps your mind sharp by making you think to remember the calls.

> I met my third husband Russell at a square dance class in Downey. Russell was born and raised in New Mexico and owned a farm there that had belonged to his dad. He had a man from that area taking care of it and raising cattle. We were married for eight years before he

We had many happy years of square and round dancing. Russell had a motor home and loved camping. We went to many of the monthly weekend campouts with the square dancing club and made some long distance trips. One trip was my niece and nephew invited me to go to to Stratton, Colorado, for my 50th high

school reunion in 1999.

One trip was to Iowa to visit my sister and brother-in-law who were hosting our family reunion that year. From there we went to South Dakota, saw the Bad Lands and Mt. Rushmore, then we drove through Wyoming, Colorado, New Mexico, and back to California.

Another year my brother and cousin hosted our family reunion in Indianapolis, which we went to. On our way home from this trip Russell and I attended the New Mexico Harding County 75th Anniversary, the county where Russell had his farm. We would stop by and check on things there when we went that way.

Some of Russell's friends still lived in the area, and he enjoyed visiting them. The county's anniversary celebration had a parade, rodeo, and barbeque on Saturday. On Sunday there was a watermelon feed, rodeo, and horseshoe tournament which Russell participated in. Russell enjoyed

playing horseshoes.

In early September of 1997 Russell had had open heart surgery with a heart valve replacement and a pace maker. He recovered from this very well. Then, unfortunately, the day before Thanksgiving in 1999 he fell off a ladder picking oranges in our back yard and broke his ankle.

After three months of recovery and

getting back to normal he had gone out in the yard to trim some of the trees. I went out to tell him lunch was ready and found him dead on the ground. It was March 2000. A blood clot took his life suddenly.

I'm sure there have been many other times of stress and possibly some that I could have had more control over, but all in all, I have had a pretty good life. Thanks to my Faith in God.




