

City Council places sales tax hike on November ballot

■ City Council Roundup: Half-cent sales tax increase would raise \$9 million annually, but will voters support it?

DOWNEY - On a 4-1 vote, the Downey City Council on Tuesday chose to place a half-cent sales tax increase on November's general election ballot.

If approved by a majority of voters, the local sales tax in Downey would increase by half a percent (0.5%), raising about \$9 million annually.

City officials say the extra funds would be used to hire additional police officers, improve public safety, and make repairs to neglected roads and parks.

The sales tax hike would expire in 2037, and funds would be monitored by an independent citizens oversight committee.

"As a rule of thumb I'm tax adverse, but the difference here is local control," said Councilman Roger Brossmer.

Mayor Alex Saab was the lone

"I've been debating this in my head for the longest time. It's something I take very seriously," said Councilman Sean Ashton. "The type of money we need is not there. We can't just tighten our belts to raise \$6 million to fix our roads."

Critics, however, point out that the funds will be deposited into the city's General Fund with no guarantee that funds are used on

"The fact that [the additional revenue] goes to the general fund, that's what makes me nervous," Saab said. "I still have too many concerns to be able to support this."

From the public's perspective, there is also skepticism that additional revenue is necessary to meet the city's needs.

"I don't buy it," Downey resident Misty Linden Hausmann wrote on the Downey Patriot's Facebook page. "Downey has more tax revenue

Ballot Language

Here is how the ballot language is currently drafted to read on November's ballot:

TRANSACTIONS AND USE TAX. To maintain and improve city services including city-run police and fire departments, paramedic/9-1-1 emergency response, anti-gang/drug/ crime programs, school safety, after-school and seniors programs; ensure fire engines and emergency vehicles have updated equipment; and repair streets/potholes; shall the ordinance to increase the sales tax by one-half of one percent, providing \$9,000,000 annually, to expire after 20 years, requiring audits, public disclosure of funds, and all funds only for Downey be adopted?

coming in than ever before with all sales tax increase. the new businesses, retail businesses. Home sales are doing very well also.

"I agree more officers are needed but they need to find the money another way. Raising taxes can't be their only idea."

City Manager Gilbert Livas said the new Promenade shopping center will generate about \$2-\$2-1/2 million annually once the center is fully developed.

But that additional revenue will be negated by increasing costs, most notably the city's financial obligations to CalPERS, the retirement system for public employees.

Livas added that Downey employs 109 police officers today, down from about 124 officers a decade ago. And crime continues to escalate due to prisoners being released from jail early.

"I don't need studies to tell me that putting more officers on the street will reduce crime," said Police Chief Carl Charles, responding to a question from Mayor Pro Tem Fernando Vasquez. "I don't think there's any doubt more police officers are needed in Downey.

"At some point do we reach a saturation point? Probably, but we're nowhere near that."

In February, the city council hired the consulting firm of Fairbank, Maslin, Maullin, Metz & Associates, the same agency that helped Downey Unified pass its \$248 million bond in

Last week, the three unions representing Downey police officers announced their support for the

"We are confident in the safeguards that are being proposed, such as a clearly defined citizen's oversight committee, that the halfcent sales tax revenue will be spent appropriately and on its intended purpose," officers said in a joint statement. "We would not put our credibility on the line if we didn't feel the half-cent sales tax increase wasn't absolutely necessary."

2016-17 BUDGET: Council members approved a \$156.7 million fiscal budget for 2016-17.

Downey's "diversified tax base and geographical location have led to a strong recovery from the most recent economic downturn," finance director Anil Gandhy wrote in a report to the City Council, adding that property tax revenue increased 3.7% from last year, while income from sales tax jumped 5.8%.

However, Gandhy warned that the city still has "significant unfunded needs for the infrastructure and services the Downey residents are used to."

The balanced budget included a \$500,000 appropriation from city reserves for license plate readers and \$450,000 for various park projects.

The license plate readers will be placed at major entrances into Downey and alert police of stolen cars and criminal suspects entering

Rick Rodriguez garners local support in bid for City Council

DOWNEY – Downey City Council hopeful Rick Rodriguez promised to bring both commitment and integrity back to city government during a speech at his official campaign kickoff fundraiser last

Surrounded by friends, family, and community leaders at the Rio Hondo Event Center, Rodriguez stressed the need for steady leadership and experience in a time of dramatic development and change for the city of Downey.

"I promised to work hard if elected," he said. "I'm not the most educated guy in the room, but I will be the most truthful guy in the

Rodriguez, 55, is founder of RMI International, an international security firm that operates in 18 states and three countries. The company is currently contracted to patrol Downtown Downey.

Nonetheless, Rodriguez said he's ready to show voters his record of achievement and local leadership.

"I'm not afraid of the big political machine I'm running against," he said. "We don't need state and federal people telling us how to run our business here."

Fire Management Association, which represents the assistant fire chief and battalion chiefs.

The agreement includes 3% across the board salary raises. There are also increases to other incentives and merit pay:

incentive pay (5% for associate's six months. degree or California State Fire Officer Certificate with 15 units or related coursework, and 8.5% for bachelor's degree or California State Chief Fire Officer or equivalent;

Addition of longevity pay provision: 10 years at 5.5% and 20 years at 8.402%;

■Increase in medical opt-out rates (in lieu of city-paid medical coverage) from \$150 to \$300 per month for employee-only coverage, and from \$500 to \$650 per month for employee plus two or more dependents;

■Increase in bilingual pay from \$46.15 to \$70 biweekly;

■Increase in sick leave conversion maximum for deposit into the city's retirement health savings plan at retirement or death from 2,363 to 2,850 hours for 56-hour employees and from 1,575 to 1,900 hours for 40-hour employees.

CITY FEES: The city is raising fees on various services -- mostly in public works -- to better match their actual cost of service, officials

The increased fees are expected to generate an additional \$25,000 annually.

Hefty fines have been put in place for those in possession and use of illegal fireworks. Fines begin at \$2,000 for a first offense and increase for subsequent offenses up to \$3,000.

The City of Downey has a "zero tolerance" for illegal fireworks. Any firework that launches into the air, propels across the ground, or explodes, is illegal to sell or possess and can result in fines and/or arrest. Legal fireworks may be purchased between July 1-4 at one of the local fireworks stands by a Downey non-profit organization.

The Twilight Summer Concert series will begin this Wednesday, July 6, at 7 p.m. at Furman Park. Various performers will open the series so make sure you arrive early. It is an evening promised to be full of family fun with great live music.

Besides the aforementioned wonderful events, the City of Downey also offers great transportation services to its residents. Many may not be aware but the Downey LINK operates Monday through Friday with four circulating routes. The fare is only 50¢ with free transfers to other routes.

As many of you have already noticed, Downey continues to grow. A variety of businesses are bringing with them new services and goods to our community. This project consists of rehabilitation of the existing pavement for the entire length of the project between Brookshire Avenue and Lakewood Boulevard, raised median island construction and modifications including retrofitting of median island irrigation with recycled water, miscellaneous repair of concrete surfaces (i.e., curb and gutter, sidewalk, driveway approaches, curb ramps), adjusting of manholes, valve covers and survey monuments to grade, and replacement of traffic striping and markings.

Every attempt will be made to minimize disruption during construction, however, please expect some traffic delays. Once completed, our City will not only look even nicer, but our infrastructure will be upgraded.

The media has a huge blind spot on terrorism

Shortly before the United Kingdom's "Brexit" vote, the shocking murder of Jo Cox — a member of parliament and a vocal Remain supporter — exposed the racist roots of elements in the victorious Leave campaign.

That much you may have heard.

What you might not have heard about were the suspect's ties to a neo-Nazi organization based here in the United States. Accused shooter Thomas Mair, The Washington Post reported, "was a longtime supporter of the National Alliance, a once-prominent white supremacist group."

According to the Southern Poverty Law Center, the Post explained, "Mair bought a manual from the organization that included instructions on how to build a pistol." Cox, it adds, "was shot by a weapon that witnesses described as either homemade or antique."

The National Alliance was founded in 1974 by William Pierce. The group was a reorganization of the National Youth Alliance, which was itself an outgrowth of an organization that supported the 1968 presidential campaign of segregationist George Wallace.

Pierce turned the group, in the words of the SPLC, into "the most dangerous and best organized neo-Nazi formation in America."

While head of the National Alliance, Pierce published The Turner Diaries, a novel that gleefully imagines a guerrilla race war and the mass murder of failed to go off a year earlier, got 49 mentions in the same time frame. It's a FBI building helped inspire Timothy McVeigh's 1995 bombing of a government by Muslims as inherently more newsworthy than others. building in Oklahoma City, which killed 168 people.

When he was arrested, McVeigh had photocopied pages of the novel with him in his car. And phone records revealed that McVeigh had called a National Alliance number seven times the day before the bombing.

In the days after, feverish speculation abounded that the attack might've been the work of international Islamic terrorists. Yet once it became clear that domestic right-wing extremists were responsible, journalists seemed to lose interest. Few spent any time examining the National Alliance connection.

Yet the group turned up in another more recent terrorism story, when Kevin Harpham planted a bomb filled with shrapnel and rat poison at the 2011 Martin Luther King Day parade in Spokane. Harpham, a one-time National Alliance member, is currently serving a 32-year prison sentence for the attempted bombing.

If you don't remember this story, that's probably because it got very little coverage. It was mentioned only three times on the nightly news in the 10 weeks that followed.

> Grant was eventually fired by Disney, which was then WABC's owner, for gloating over the death of Commerce Secretary Ron Brown, who was African-American. But even then, his connection to the neo-Nazi National Alliance didn't become an issue.

ISIS must really love Donald Trump

As the sun set over New York on June 12, hundreds of Muslims gathered in Hudson River Park to break their Ramadan fast together.

Iftar, the evening Ramadan meal, is often a joyous celebration of faith and family. But the mood that Sunday was solemn: That morning, news had broken of the ghastly massacre of LGBTQ revelers at Pulse nightclub in Orlando.

A lone Muslim had allegedly perpetrated the attack. Here by the Hudson, over 200 knelt in prayer.

"We're praying for those who were lost," one woman explained in a video circulated by the Huffington Post, her voice breaking. "As Muslims, we're united in our outrage over this senseless act of violence."

Meanwhile, an Orlando imam condemned terrorism as un-Islamic and affirmed his belief that "Islam teaches peace." The Florida chapter of a national Muslim group called on members to donate blood for the victims. And statements of sympathy tumbled forth from American Muslims in what CBS News called "an avalanche."

"Today, we stand in solidarity with the LGBTQ community," said the group Muslim Advocates. "Your grief is our grief. Your outrage is our outrage."

Unfortunately, none of those touching gestures deterred Donald Trump from warning darkly that "radical Islam is coming to our shores."

In a falsehood-riddled speech following the Orlando massacre, the

presumptive GOP nominee blamed the shooting on immigration and "political" is to make Muslims feel unwelcome there.

As Muslims all over America sent their sympathies to Orlando, Trump advertisements. mocked his Democratic rival's insistence that "Muslims are peaceful and tolerant people." He accused Muslims of causing "death and destruction" by covering up terrorism in their midst (though it was later revealed that a Muslim member of Mateen's community had reported him as suspicious).

Then, in perhaps the most ominous part of the address, Trump claimed that Democrats will "take away Americans' guns and then admit the very people who want to slaughter us."

Muslim immigrants are the problem, he seems to be saying. And guns are

If you ask me, I'd feel much safer with the crowd at Hudson River Park than anywhere near a rally of armed Trump supporters. But here's the creepier part: For all his blathering that "we have to get smart" about "radical Islam," Trump is stupidly playing right into ISIS's hands.

Like Trump himself, the group benefits immensely from anything that by Trump. drives a wedge between Muslims and the societies they live in.

ISIS said as much itself — in plain English — in a publication detailing its plan to "destroy the gray zone" between infidels and believers. Since most Muslims seem to like living in the liberal societies of Europe and North America, ISIS propagandists have written, the only way to drive up recruitment

No wonder ISIS recruiters are now featuring Donald Trump in

It's not because they're afraid of him — it's because few people are working harder to make Muslims feel unwelcome than he is. Civil rights groups report that Trump's rise has paralleled a shocking increase in hate crimes against Muslims in this country.

That's an outrage. And it's thoroughly self-defeating.

In fact, the United States has arguably the most prosperous, well-integrated Muslim population in the western world. Even as ISIS has scored a few recruiting successes among the much more marginalized Muslim communities of Europe — though even there the group falls way outside the mainstream it's flat-lined here.

Scenes like the iftar gathering in New York, in other words, are the rule, not the exception. They're a touching rejoinder to the toxic politics of division, and a far more accurate reflection of our Muslim neighbors than anything peddled

And, not least, they're a much better asset in the fight against terrorism than any bullet or bomb — or any demagogue who urges his followers to reach for their guns at the first sign of trouble.

For those eligible, voting should be easy

The elections process is not usually grist for inflammatory rhetoric. But this year has been different. Republican Donald Trump labeled the GOP primary process "crooked." Democrat Bernie Sanders suggested his party's use of superdelegates made its nominating process a "rigged system." For many voters, the intricacies of voting rules quickly became a topic of overriding interest.

Now that the primaries are over, I hope Americans remain just as intrigued by the laws governing general-election voting in their states. Because at the moment, this country is engaged in an experiment with the democratic process that should rivet everyone who cares about representative government.

We've seen two diverging trends in the states in recent years. One approach has sought to make voting more difficult. Since the 2010 elections, 22 states have put laws in place narrowing voters' ability to go to the polls. They have decreased the time allotted for voting; added tough ID requirements; reduced options for voting prior to Election Day; added proof-of-citizenship requirements; and made it necessary for voters to register well before election day. These steps, their backers contend, are necessary to guard against voter fraud and assure the integrity of the ballot.

Other states have moved in the opposite direction. They've made it easier to register to vote; have added longer hours for voting on election day; have moved to mail-in ballots; and encourage early voting. They've done all they can to make the process of voting simple and convenient.

On the whole, Republicans at the state level have favored greater restrictiveness and Democrats greater ease, but you don't have to be a partisan of one side or the other to recognize that politicians believe a great deal is at

you can be sure they are also calculating the effect of rules changes on the outcome of elections, and they'll do all they can to tilt the rules in their favor.

Which is why the question of how to approach the right to vote isn't going to be settled any time soon. There are a lot of court cases pending in the various states, and it's likely there will be conflicting judicial opinions.

If we're going to debate the electoral process as a nation, let's keep in mind the core issue: it should be easy to vote — and hard to cheat. Casting your ballot to limit voting will have a pernicious effect on our system of representative

The evidence on this is mixed. A recent paper by political scientists at UC San Diego analyzing turnout between 2008 and 2012 in states with strict voter ID laws found that they depressed voting overall — more among Democratic constituencies, but among Republicans, too. Yet recent research also suggests that the opposite is not true: easing voting rules in states that never tightened them does not necessarily boost turnout.

One certainty in all this is that a lot of people who are eligible to vote for various reasons do not choose to do so. Of the 219 million Americans eligible to vote in 2014, the Census Bureau reported last year, roughly 41 million were not registered; and turnout in actual elections is even lower. Voting behavior may be more related to motivation than it is to statutory activity.

A more pressing certainty is that our entire voting system needs attention.

Paul Tanaka, former LASD undersheriff, gets 5 years in prison for jail beatings



GARDENA - Paul Tanaka, who was the second in command of the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department, was sentenced Monday to 60 months in federal prison for his conviction on obstruction of justice charges stemming from him leading the LASD's efforts to derail a federal investigation into corruption and civil rights violations by sheriff's deputies at two downtown jail complexes.

Tanaka, 57, a resident of Gardena who left the LASD in 2013 when he was the undersheriff, was sentenced by United States District Judge Percy Anderson.

In addition to the five-year prison term, which Tanaka was ordered to begin serving on August 1, Judge Anderson ordered him to pay a \$7,500 fine.

In sentencing Tanaka, Judge Anderson recounted Tanaka's career at the LASD, his role in the scheme to obstruct justice, and "the incalculable harm you have caused this community."

While he was the assistant sheriff in charge of the jails, Tanaka "perpetrated an environment of excessive deputy conduct," according to Judge Anderson, who said Tanaka's actions led directly to an increased number of use-of-force incidents obstruction of justice scheme was designed "to derail the federal grand jury investigation" and constituted "a gross abuse of the public trust."

A federal jury on April 6 found Tanaka guilty of two felony offenses - conspiring to obstruct justice and a substantive count of obstructing justice. After a 10-day trial, a federal jury deliberated for only a few hours the head of a broad conspiracy to obstruct the federal investigation, LASD learned that an inmate at the could act with impunity, which, Men's Central Jail (MCJ) was an FBI informant.

Tanaka directed a conspiracy that has resulted in the conviction of other former LASD officials who received sentences of up to 41 months in prison.

"Paul Tanaka supervised scheme to obstruct the FBI's investigation into corruption and civil rights violations at the jails," said United States Attorney Eileen M. Decker. "Mr. Tanaka was the ringleader and the driving force behind a plot that concealed an FBI informant, tampered with witnesses and led to the threatened arrest of an FBI agent for doing nothing investigation started in August 2011 more than her job. In addition to being a top law enforcement officer who was personally involved in the obstruction of justice, Mr. Tanaka was responsible for a culture that unfortunately led to the widespread abuse of inmates at the jails that he personally oversaw."

Tanaka was the undersheriff the number 2 in the LASD - until 2013, and he ran an unsuccessful campaign for sheriff in 2014. As he rose through ranks during a 31year career with the LASD, Tanaka became well aware of problems with deputies at the jails, allegations of rampant abuse of inmates and

against inmates at the jails. The insufficient internal investigations into deputy misconduct.

"During his time as an executive, defendant threatened to discipline supervisors who frequently referred deputies to Internal Affairs, transferred captains who tried to reduce deputy abuse and break up cliques, instructed deputies to work in the 'gray area' of law enforcement, and expressed his desire to gut before convicting Tanaka of being Internal Affairs," prosecutors wrote in a sentencing memorandum filed with the court. Tanaka's "actions a scheme that started when the caused deputies to believe that they unfortunately, they did much too frequently."

> "Mr. Tanaka swore to serve the county of Los Angeles, but disappointed the people through his corrupt actions, as well as many in the department under his command and influence," said Deirdre Fike, Assistant Director in Charge of the FBI's Los Angeles Field Office. "As this investigation comes to a close, the department's law-abiding deputies who serve honorably can put this behind them under new leadership at the L.A. Sheriff's Department."

> The scheme to disrupt the federal when deputies recovered a mobile phone from an inmate in MCJ, linked the phone to the FBI, and determined that the inmate was an informant in the FBI's corruption and civil rights investigation. The phone was given to the inmate as part of an undercover investigation by a corrupt deputy, who subsequently pleaded guilty to a federal bribery

charge and was recently sentenced to fellow deputies not to speak to the federal prison.

In response to the federal investigation, members of the Tanaka-led conspiracy took steps to hide the cooperator from the FBI and the United States Marshals Service, which was attempting to bring the inmate to testify before a federal grand jury. The evidence presented during Tanaka's trial showed that the deputies altered records to make it appear that the cooperator had been released from jail, when in fact he had been re-booked into custody an LASD patrol station. Members of the conspiracy prohibited FBI access to the informant, and then told the cooperator that he had been abandoned by the FBI.

Over the course of several weeks, members of the conspiracy sought an order from a Los Angeles Superior Court judge to compel the FBI to turn over information about its investigation to the LASD. After the judge refused to issue the order because he had no jurisdiction over the federal law enforcement agency and even though it was clear that the FBI was acting legally - two LASD sergeants confronted the lead FBI agent at her residence in an attempt to intimidate her. The sergeants threatened the agent with arrest and later reiterated this threat to her supervisor, stating that the agent's arrest was imminent.

Tanaka oversaw co-conspirators who told fellow deputies not to cooperate in the federal investigation. Members of the conspiracy engaged in witness tampering by ordering federal government and telling them that the FBI would lie, threaten, manipulate and blackmail them to obtain information about the Sheriff's Department.

Tanaka was indicted last year along with William Thomas Carey, a former LASD Captain who headed the Internal Criminal Investigations Bureau. Carey pleaded guilty last year and is pending sentencing. A total of 10 members of the department – including former Sheriff Leroy Baca - have been convicted in relation to under a fake name and moved to the scheme to obstruct justice. Baca, who pleaded guilty in February pursuant to a plea agreement, is scheduled to be sentenced by Judge Anderson on July 11.
