Downey, firefighters' union reach \$3.7M settlement

DOWNEY – The city of lawsuit. Downey has settled a lawsuit from Downey firefighters for \$3.7

City Council approved the settlement on to Battalion Chief, Captain, and Feb. 14, seemingly bringing to Engineer, investigating and an end a long and contentious disciplining them for spurious battle between City Hall and the allegations of misconduct, and Downey firefighters.

"The settlement of the lawsuit for \$3.7 million, the reinstatement of two firefighters to paramedic status with full pay, and the removal of all disciplinary files resulting from the retaliation against Association members is a tremendous vindication for our clients, who were the victims of a series of politically charged and vindictive actions by Downey and its officials," said Thomas M. "The City violated my clients" constitutional rights by retaliating against them for their speech, members by denying them promotions holding up negotiations on their collective bargaining agreement," Brown added.

In addition to the \$3.7 million payout, the city agreed to reinstate Jeff Simmons and Jose Garcia to paramedic status with full pay, and to destroy disciplinary records related to firefighters Dan Rasmussen, Steven Davis, Ryan Schleiger, Kevin Kim, Frank Culhno and Shawn Youngblood going back to June 1, 2013.

The city also agreed to delete files from a March 7, 2011 reprimand against firefighters Scott Devereux and Ryan Schleiger.

"As a longtime resident and supporter of our public safety professionals, I hope that the city's decision to take the high road instead of spending more time and money on this litigation would help the DFA and the city to move forward together," said Councilman Rick Rodriguez.

Planning Commission's extended scrutiny could damage Downey's reputation, critics fear

DOWNEY – Despite resulting in the approval of plans to bring a new hotel into Downey, Wednesday's Planning Commission meeting raised several eyebrows due to its multiple hour duration.

The commission spent over three hours on the agenda item, eventually passing the plans unanimously with little to nothing changed from the report and plans as they were presented. The meeting in total spanned close to five hours.

Commission Chairman Jim Rodriguez said that some agenda items take longer to work through due to their size and scope, but admitted that Wednesday's meeting was a bit of an anomaly.

"The process when you include the staff report, when you include the applicant's statements - that was probably the longest part right there," said Rodriguez. "Then what happens what he saw on Wednesday."

is you get to what is considered We didn't spend too much time said Vasquez. on the deliberation. I mean, still probably a decent amount of time - maybe an hour - but yeah, the first part of that was a long process. There were a lot of things we had to consider."

While the commission's main concerns during the project's deliberation seemed to be traffic impact and parking spaces, the commission also discussed a myriad of minute details that some think shouldn't be of concern to them.

Violent storm pummels Downey

DOWNEY - A violent storm slammed Southern California last week, flooding local streets, toppling trees, and knocking out power to an unspecified number of homes and businesses.

The storm was possibly the largest the local area has seen since 1995, officials with the National Weather Service said.

Five people throughout Southern California died as a result of the storm. No serious injuries were reported in Downey.

The downpour, combined with high winds that reached 70 miles per hour, toppled approximately 40-50 trees in Downey, city officials said.

DOWNEY – The Downey High School wrestling team captured the 2017 C.I.F. Northern Division wrestling championship last weekend at Grand Terrace High School by scoring 191.5 points.

The Vikings outscored Righetti (181), Bloomington (151), Santa Fe (110.5) and cross-town rival Warren (108.5), respectively, to earn the coveted title. This was the first C.I.F. Individual Championship in school history.

Downey had eight wrestlers place and five advance to the Master's Meet competition this weekend at the Citizens Bank Arena in Ontario. Downey (191.5), Righetti (181), Bloomington (151) and Santa Fe The Vikings had four wrestlers claim C.I.F. individual champion honors.

Lawmaker introduces bill to immediately shut down air pollution violators

Existing law regulates the emission of air pollutants and authorizes the regional AQMD's and air pollution control districts to enforce those requirements. During the last five years, with authority to immediately cease pollution operations as proposed in this bill, scenarios like Hixson Metal Finishing in Newport Beach, Anaplex Corporation in Paramount, Exide Technologies in Vernon and Ridgeline Energy Services in Santa Fe Springs, would have been ceased immediately upon detection.

These industries most likely to create a threat consistent with those who emit lead or toxic air contaminants such as hexavalent chromium, cadmium, arsenic, asbestos, and hydrogen sulfide as well as other harmful pollutants.

"This legislation will augment local air districts' existing authority and allow us to take immediate action to curtail a facility's emissions if it presents an imminent and substantial endangerment to public health," said Wayne Nastri, executive officer for the South Coast Air Quality Management District.

Assembly Bill 1132 would allow AQMD's to temporary orders and cease those operations that are in violation of either federal or state air quality requirements through a notification to the violator outlining a pending hearing within a set timeframe and process.

The order could be rescinded prior to the hearing, which must be set within 15 days of the abatement notification and be held no more than 30 days from issuance, if the accused operator can demonstrate the endangerment situation no longer exists and has been permanently corrected.

"I've lived all my life in the shadows of these atrocities operating without regard for the people being poisoned," said Garcia. "I've lived through the unfairness's based on myzip code and the inefficiencies that allow it to continue disproportionally in communities of color. It's past time we do something to address the injustice, and this bill is one step towards that challenge."

The bill is pending committee referral.

My mother Ligaya had suitors different kinds: a doctor, a school supervisor and an engineer, but nobody really became her boyfriend.

In 1940 Ligaya got a teaching job near Manila in a village called Welfareville. This village was created for orphan children, children of parents with contagious diseases, and delinquent boys and girls. This is the place and time where my parents met.

Ligaya and all single employees were provided with lodging in the dormitory. The assistant principal, Julia Diokno, was assigned to lodge in the Home Economic building and take care of school supplies. Julia asked Ligaya to accompany her especially at night.

One day a young man came and introduced himself as Juan, the half-brother of Julia. Their mother, Pastora Banaag, had been left a widow with two daughters, Julia and Tentay.

Pastora had run away and left her two daughters with her strict brother who took care of her when her husband died. Nothing was known about how Pastora lived for 10 years, until she moved to Cavite City with a baby boy, Juan, who was born in Tuy Batangas.

Pastora had been earning her living by cooking and selling food. One day she asked her neighbors, an elderly couple, Leonida Ayroso and Mr. Filler, to watch Juan while she went to the market. She did not come back.

This elderly couple did not have any children and now they were left with a baby boy they hardly knew. Out of their own kindness they adopted the baby Iking came asking Ligaya to and named him Juan Ayroso Filler. Mr. Filler worked in the US Air Force in Subic Bay.

When Juan was 6 years old, Mr. Filler died. Leonida was elderly and did not have experience started to earn a living by carrying wood and water to neighbors and doing other errands.

When Juan enrolled to go to school, the teachers helped Leonida seek a pension from the US Air Force. Juan continued to earn a living by distributing newspapers before going to school. Leonida adopted a niece to take care of her.

The university was closed and Juan looked for his half sister Julia to stay with and find a job. He got a job in Welfareville as a security quard and stayed in one of the storerooms of the school.

Juan, Ligaya and Julia practically lived in one household, sharing the kitchen, dining and bathroom. Juan would help Ligaya in washing dishes and clothes and at the same time try to hold her hand (chancing).

This continued and then later Juan would steal a kiss. Ligaya, who had never been kissed, liked it. One day a woman came looking for Juan. Juan took the woman to his room for several hours. Ligaya was hurt and told Julia that she will stop helping her since she has her brother to help her.

Ligaya went to her dormitory. Juan tried to talk to her but she did not want to talk to him and avoided him. Juan was so in love with Ligaya that he asked the help of Ligaya's brother Albert who was also working in Welfareville.

Ligaya refused Albert's help. When Ligaya was scheduled to visit her father in Pagsanjan, Juan asked Iking, a family friend of Ligaya, to help get him a chance to talk to Ligaya. They were able to visit Ligaya in her dormitory.

As soon as Ligaya met them Juan fell on his knees crying for a chance to court her. Ligaya said, "No. You will not even pass my father's criteria. You are not from the Pagsanian and are eight years younger than me."

Juan said, "I will face your father and introduce myself. I will go with you to Pagsanjan." Juan asked Iking to introduce him to Ligaya's father. They took the same bus to Pagsanjan.

Ligaya went directly to her grandmother's house across from her father's house while Iking and Juan went to the house of Ligaya's father. Ligaya didn't know what happened there.

After several hours Juan and sign a marriage license. Ligaya was so surprised. Juan and Iking explained to Ligaya that her father asked questions about Juan and Iking's recommendation.

He asked Juan's intention. earning a living. The little boy Juan Juan said, "I love Ligaya and want to marry her". The father explained that with the war condition, it was scary to have a single daughter. He heard of single women raped by the Japanese. So if Juan was ready to marry Ligaya, he could marry her.

> So Juan got the marriage license with the help of Iking. Everything was arranged. After Ligaya signed the marriage license, all the cousins started cooking and preparing an altar at the grandma's house and called a priest to celebrate the wedding.

> After the wedding Ligaya stayed at the grandmother's house and Juan stayed at Iking's house. The following day they had to go back to Manila. Iking got a room in a hotel owned by Ligaya's cousin for Juan and Ligaya's onenight honeymoon.

> Afraid that they may lose their jobs, they kept their marriage secret. Ligaya stayed in the dormitory, Juan continued staying in the school storeroom. When they told their secret to Julia, Julia said, "Do not be afraid to lose your job. You have to live together."

> Juan and Ligaya announced their marriage and rented an apartment. They did not lose their jobs. And the rest is history.

To save Main Street, tax Wall Street

All too often these days, large U.S. corporations and Wall Street banks seem more interested in tapping overseas markets than in growing a customer base at home. When local communities in America's heartland suffer, it's no skin off their backs.

By contrast, our nation's small businesses depend on the health of their communities. When young people don't have the opportunity to get an education and a good job, these Main Street businesses take a

Unfortunately, this up and coming generation is entering a job market with too few opportunities to earn enough money to make a down payment on a house, eat in restaurants, or support local merchants.

Times are especially hard for the millions of young people who are saddled with crushing student debt. Last year's college graduates owed an average of more than \$37,000, a historic high.

The lack of affordable education for middle-class families limits young Americans' prospects for the future and undermines the health of our economy. The small business sector, which needs local customers with strong buying power to survive, especially suffers.

For our long-term prosperity, it's critical that we help current student borrowers reduce their debts and start moving on a path towards debtfree college. The question is how we pay for it.

Many people claim our national coffers are empty. We have no choice, they say, but to accept that affordable higher education is simply beyond our means.

In reality, this country — the richest in the world — has abundant resources to ensure a world class college education for all. The problem is that too great a share of our resources is going into too few pockets.

Congress deserves much of the blame. Under pressure from lobbyists, lawmakers have filled the tax code with loopholes that benefit many of our country's wealthiest individuals and corporations. If we simply eliminated these perverse loopholes, we could raise massive revenues for

education and other urgent economic needs.

One of the most extreme examples of tax privilege is the so-called "carried interest" loophole. This allows private equity and hedge fund managers to claim the bulk of their income as capital gains, which is taxed at only 20 percent, instead of the top marginal income tax rate of 39.6

This means some of the wealthiest Americans pay a lower tax rate than millions of our country's teachers, firefighters, and nurses.

Getting rid of this unfair loophole would raise at least \$15.6 billion over 10 years, and some tax experts believe it could raise more than 10 times that amount. A strong majority of Americans are opposed to the carried interest loophole — by 68 percent to 17 percent, according to Bloomberg. On the campaign trail, Donald Trump also called for closing

In areas that are home to many Wall Street financiers, some elected officials are considering closing the carried interest loophole at the state level. Such proposals are moving forward in New York, Massachusetts, Connecticut, New Jersey, and Rhode Island as part of a regionally

tax avoidance problem among our wealthiest individuals and largest the past. corporations. Their tax-dodging sucks wealth out of local communities, leaving the customers that are the lifeblood of small businesses to absorb a larger share of our mutual tax responsibility.

We need new rules that rein in the excesses of our financial industry and hold corporations and wealthy individuals accountable to pay their fair share in taxes. Only then can we create the opportunities our young people deserve and return community wealth to the hands of local



Fact is indeed stranger than fiction: picture a type of marine algae that tastes like bacon! It's high in fiber, vitamins, minerals, antioxidants, and protein...and is fat free.



It's called dulse (rhymes with pulse), and is available online (try Amazon) and at some Whole Foods markets. I bought this seaweed dried, in whole-leaf form, and fried it in a small amount of olive oil for about one minute on each side. The saltiness (it grows in salt water, of the olive oil, and the flavor are definitely reminiscent of bacon.

My wife - let's just say that she was highly skeptical – shared it with me, and even she

enjoyed it! My office staff, typically more interested in chocolate than in marine vegetation, was enthusiastic as

Dulse has been harvested and eaten, often in soups, in Northern norovirus Europe for hundreds of years or more. The earliest written accounts date back to the 15th century. Today, it is dried and sold for up to \$90 a pound as a cooking ingredient or nutritional supplement, often in then putting your hand or fingers in your mouth powder or flake form.

dried whole-leaf dulse with oil over medium-high heat until crisp, then slap it between two slices of bread with lettuce, tomato, and mayonnaise for a DLT. Eat raw or cooked dulse as a snack, or add it to sandwiches and salads.

At Oregon State University, researchers who were originally developing a super-food for abalone developed a new strain of dulse that grows very quickly and can be farmed. Chefs working with it have come up with a long list of recipes ranging from crackers and salad dressing to beer and ice cream.

What makes this seaweed exciting is that it isn't difficult to produce, and the Oregon strain in particular could become an efficient and lucrative crop. Dulse has a shelf life of about ten days in the refrigerator, and can last a very long time in dried form.

My conclusion is that dulse is tasty, nourishing, and has the potential to be a pretty flexible ingredient in recipes. If you are choosing nutritionally between bacon and seaweed...seaweed wins!

It's norovirus season: here's how to stay protected from the stomach bug

Norovirus causes many people to become ill with vomiting and diarrhea each year. You can help protect yourself and others by washing your hands often and following simple tips to stay healthy.

Noroviruses are a group of related viruses that can cause gastroenteritis (GAS-tro-en-ter-I-tis), which is inflammation of the stomach and intestines. This leads to cramping, nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea.

CDC estimates that each year Norovirus causes 19 to 21 million after all), the nice crunch, the slight greasiness illnesses, 56,000 to 71,000 hospitalizations and 570 to 800 deaths. Anyone can get infected with norovirus and you can get it more than once. It is estimated that a person will get norovirus about 5 times during their lifetime. Many people usually get sick with norovirus in cooler months, especially from November to April.

> Norovirus spreads quickly. It is found in the vomit and stool of infected people. You can get it by:

- Eating food or drinking liquids that are contaminated with
- Touching surfaces or objects with norovirus on them and
- Having direct contact with a person who is infected with Bon Appétit suggests: To achieve that bacon-like effect, pan-fry some norovirus, for example, when caring for someone with norovirus or sharing foods or eating utensils with them

People with norovirus illness are contagious from the moment they begin feeling sick and for the first few days after they recover. Some people may be contagious for even longer. There is no vaccine to prevent norovirus infection or drug to treat sick people. Learn how to protect yourself and others by following a few simple

Practice proper hand hygiene

Wash your hands carefully with soap and water, especially after using the toilet and changing diapers and always before eating or preparing food. If soap and water aren't available, use an alcoholbased hand sanitizer. These alcohol-based products can help reduce the number of germs on your hands, but they are not a substitute for washing with soap and water.

Take care in the kitchen

Carefully rinse fruits and vegetables, and cook oysters and other shellfish thoroughly before eating.

Do not prepare food while infected

People with norovirus illness should not prepare food for others while they have symptoms and for at least 2 days after they recover from their illness. Also see For Food Workers: Norovirus and Working with Food.

Clean and disinfect contaminated surfaces

After throwing up or having diarrhea, immediately clean and disinfect contaminated surfaces using a bleach-based household cleaner as directed on the product label. If no such cleaning product is available, you can use a solution made with 5 tablespoons to 1.5 cups of household bleach per 1 gallon of water.

Wash laundry thoroughly

Immediately remove and wash clothing or linens that may be contaminated with vomit or stool. Handle soiled items carefully try not to shake them —to avoid spreading virus. If available, Contributed by the CDC



wear rubber or disposable gloves while handling soiled clothing or linens and wash your hands after handling. Wash soiled items with detergent at the maximum available cycle length and then machine dry.

Norovirus spreads quickly from person to person in enclosed places like nursing homes, daycare centers, schools, and cruise ships. It is also a major cause of outbreaks in restaurants and catered-meal settings if contaminated food is served.

You may hear norovirus illness called "food poisoning" or "stomach flu." Norovirus can cause foodborne illness, as can other germs and chemicals.

Norovirus illness is not related to the flu (influenza). Though they may share some of the same symptoms, the flu is a respiratory illness caused by influenza virus.

For most people norovirus illness is not serious and they get better in 1 to 3 days. But it can be serious in young children, the elderly, and people with other health conditions. It can lead to severe dehydration, hospitalization and even death.

There is no specific medicine to treat people with norovirus illness. Norovirus infection cannot be treated with antibiotics because it is a viral (not a bacterial) infection.

If you have norovirus illness, you should drink plenty of liquids to replace fluid lost from throwing up and diarrhea. This will help prevent dehydration.

Sports drinks and other drinks without caffeine or alcohol can help with mild dehydration. But, these drinks may not replace important nutrients and minerals. Oral rehydration fluids that you can get over the counter are most helpful for mild dehydration.

Dehydration can lead to serious problems. Severe dehydration may require hospitalization for treatment with fluids given through your vein (intravenous or IV fluids). If you think you or someone you are caring for is severely dehydrated, call the doctor.

SACRAMENTO - Assemblyman Jay Obernolte (R-Hesperia) has introduced legislation that would allow bicyclists to travel through stop signs without stopping.

AB 1103 would allow bicyclists to slow as they approach a stop sign, assess the safety of proceeding, and "continue with caution" without making a full stop.

Obermolte said requiring bicyclists to make complete stops at stop signs "causes safety hazards for bicyclists since lost momentum results in more time spent in each intersection and greater potential for collision with vehicles."

"This common sense bicycle law will increase safety by minimizing the potential for collision between cars and bicycles," Obernolte said. "This measure will not only make bicyclists safer, but it will also protect motorists by diverting cyclists away from busy roadways."






Downey space center to host 'City of STEM'

Cerritos newspaper erroneously reports on local election

CERRITOS – In response to an article published in the "Los Cerritos Community News" on Feb. 17, and a letter received by Cerritos' city clerk's office on the same date claiming that a Cerritos City Council candidate running in the current election has violated the City Charter's term limits, Cerritos City Attorney Mark Steres has issued the following statement:

"The exact question raised by the letter received by the City Clerk on February 17, 2017, and by the article on February 17, 2017, in the 'Los Cerritos Community News' has already been addressed by the California Attorney General in 2004 (Attorney General Opinion No. 04-907). The California Attorney General concluded that the Cerritos City Charter imposes only a two-year period of ineligibility prior to serving the next term of office.

The California Attorney General ruled that following two consecutive terms of office, a former council member may run for election at the next municipal election that follows in two years. As such, the former council member is eligible to run for City Council at the upcoming April 11, 2017 election. This interpretation of the Cerritos City Charter has been applied consistently by the City Clerk's office since the term limit proposition (Proposition H) was adopted by the voters in 1986.

What is a tankless water heater and should you buy one?

Tankless water heaters, also known as demand-type or instantaneous water heaters, provide hot water only as it is needed. They don't produce the standby energy losses associated with storage water heaters, which can save you money.

Here you'll find basic information about how they work, whether a tankless water heater might be right for your home, and what criteria to use when selecting the right model.

HOW THEY WORK

Tankless water heaters heat water directly without the use of a storage tank. When a hot water tap is turned on, cold water travels through a pipe into the unit. Either a gas burner or an electric element heats the water.

As a result, tankless water heaters deliver a constant supply of hot water. You don't need to wait for a storage tank to fill up with enough hot water. However, a tankless water heater's output limits the flow rate.

Typically, tankless water heaters provide hot water at a rate of 2-5 gallons (7.6-15.2 liters) per minute. Gas-fired tankless water heaters produce higher flow rates than electric ones. Sometimes, however, even the largest, gas-fired model cannot supply enough hot water for simultaneous, multiple uses in large households.

ADVANTAGES AND DISADVANTAGES

For homes that use 41 gallons or less of hot water daily, demand water heaters can be 24%-34% more energy efficient than conventional storage tank water heaters. They can be 8%-14% more energy efficient for homes that use a lot of hot water -around 86 gallons per day.

You can achieve even greater energy savings of 27%-50% if you install a demand water heater at each hot water outlet. Energy Star estimates that a typical family can save \$100 or more per year with an Energy Star qualified tankless water heater.

The initial cost of a tankless water heater is greater than that of a conventional storage water heater, but tankless water heaters will typically last longer and have lower operating and energy costs, which could offset its higher purchase price. Most tankless water heaters have a life expectancy of more than 20 years. They also have easily replaceable parts that extend their life by many more

In contrast, storage water heaters last 10–15 years.

Tankless water heaters can avoid the standby heat losses associated with storage water heaters. However, although gas-fired tankless water heaters tend to have higher flow rates than electric ones, they can waste energy if they have a constantly burning pilot light. This can sometimes offset the elimination of standby energy losses when compared to a storage water heater.

In a gas-fired storage water heater, the pilot light heats the

The cost of operating a pilot light in a tankless water heater varies from model to model. Ask the manufacturer how much gas the pilot light uses for the model you're considering. If you purchase a model that uses a standing pilot light, you can always turn it off when it's not in use to save energy.

Also consider models that have an intermittent ignition device (IID) instead of a standing pilot light. This device resembles the spark ignition device on some gas kitchen ranges and ovens.




