# Man arrested for running over security guard at Gloria's

**DOWNEY** – A man accused of intentionally running over a security guard after he was asked to leave a Downey restaurant turned himself in on Friday, police

Hector Jonathan Aceves Vallejo was arrested on suspicion of attempted murder in connection with the incident, which occurred last Thursday at Gloria's Cocina Mexicana Restaurant, the Downey Police Department said in a news release.

Officers responded to the Mexican restaurant at 7401 Florence Ave. around 10:20 p.m. on May 17 and found the 49-yearold guard suffering from a head wound, officials said. He was taken to the hospital in critical condition.

Another security guard at Gloria's told KTLA that the victim, who is named Joseph and has children, was in a coma on Friday.

Police learned that the incident began as a "disturbance" inside the restaurant between Vallejo and several women, the release states.

The guard escorted Vallejo out of the premises and asked him to leave, but then the two men became engaged in a verbal dispute in the business' parking

Vallejo then allegedly got in his car, striking the guard as he drove off.

Marvin Vargas, who goes to Gloria's regularly, told KTLA he recognized the victim and expressed sympathy for him.

"[Gloria's] is a safe place, but sometimes there's just people that they're not in their right mind," Vargas added. "I mean, you can actually be in your own house and something might happen. Somebody might drive by and there's a drive-by shooting."

Although Vallejo has since turned himself in, officers are still looking to speak with two women who were with him Thursday night.

# Cristina Garcia cleared of most serious charges

► The Assemblymember still faces discipline for using vulgar language and making disparaging remarks about her colleagues.

**DOWNEY** – Assemblymember Cristina Garcia faces discipline for making homophobic slurs and using vulgar language at work, but the most serious allegation of sexual misconduct could not be substantiated, according to the results of an Assembly investigation.

Garcia, a Democratic lawmaker who represents Downey in the state Capitol, was accused of drunkenly groping a former legislative staff member at a 2014 softball game. The staff member, Daniel Fierro, accused Garcia of squeezing his backside and attempting to grab his

Garcia denied the allegations but took an unpaid leave from the Assembly in February pending results of an investigation.

Last week, officials announced that the investigation could not corroborate Fierro's allegations.

"I look forward to returning to work and getting back to the business of representing my constituents," Garcia said in a statement Thursday declaring that she had been "exonerated." Her spokeswoman said she has not yet that a sitting member of the decided on a return date to the

exactly the same way as investigations into other members of the Assembly have been," Rendon said. "While this investigation was conducted strictly by the book, I have consistently agreed that the policy needs to be updated."

Meanwhile, Fierro said he is considering an appeal of the investigation's results. He criticized Garcia for publicly commenting on the investigation before Fierro had a chance to appeal.

"I find it incredibly inappropriate Assembly would jump ahead of an established appeal process and release information before it was appropriate," Fierro told the Sacramento Bee.

According to the Assembly investigation substantiated at least three complaints about inappropriate behavior by Garcia, including that she "disparaged other elected officials," according to a letter sent Thursday to the lawyer for several former employees who submitted a claim against her.

In February, former staffer J. David Kernick filed a complaint with the state, seeking to sue Garcia for allegedly firing him in 2014 after he refused to play spin the bottle with her. Garcia denied the accusation.

Kernick's lawyer, Dan Gilleon of San Diego, had days earlier on behalf of four anonymous former employees describing a "toxic environment" of heavy drinking and graphic sexual discussions in Garcia's office.

"I want to inform you that three

trained investigators was conducted of the complaints you presented on behalf of your clients were substantiated," Debra Gravert, the Assembly's chief administrative officer, wrote in a letter to Gilleon on Thursday. "Based upon those findings, the Assembly has taken appropriate remedial measures with respect to Assemblymember Garcia designed to prevent this or similar behavior in the future."

> Gravert said the Assembly found that Garcia had "commonly and pervasively used vulgar language with, to and around staff" and had asked her staff to perform personal errands, in addition to the disparaging remarks about her colleagues.

> Garcia previously admitted in a March interview with KQED that she used homophobic slurs against former Assembly Speaker John A.

> "I would like to sincerely apologize to my colleagues in the Legislature, my staff and most importantly to the residents of the 58th Assembly District for instances where my use of language was less than professional," Garcia said in her statement. "I want to assure everyone that I have learned from this experience and will do everything in my power to make amends for my past."

> "Nothing is more important to me than protecting the health and safety of the people I represent," she added. "I know that I can only effectively serve my constituents if staff and my colleagues feel comfortable and respected on the job. That is the climate I pledge to build and sustain."

# Plans move forward on downtown improvement district

► Downtown property owners still need to approve the district, which would finance services and programs exclusively for downtown.

**DOWNEY** – Plans for a potential community benefit district (CBD) are now in the hands of property owners, as the City Council gave staff the go-ahead on Tuesday to move forward with efforts that could further revitalize downtown.

According to a staff report presented to council members, there has been an increase in demand of services - including street sweeping, steam cleaning, security, and public art, - due to the

rapid growth of Downtown Downey.

The creation of a CBD would in theory provide downtown property owners with finances to better control and fund special events, marketing, promotional activities, space development, security, beautification, property enhancements, and a property owner led governance body for the administration of the services.

If approved, the CBD would raise over \$253,000 annually for the

The district would consist of approximately 10 to 12 square blocks, consisting of 90 parcels and 59 property owners.

# Warren High senior selected for Gates Scholarship

► The scholarship will cover all of Alejandra Barreto's undergraduate expenses, including tuition, books, housing and health insurance.

**DOWNEY** – A first-generation college student from a family born in Jalisco, Mexico, Alejandra Barreto moved to Downey from Lynwood when she was in middle school.

Attending West (now Stauffer) Middle School her seventhgrade year, then transitioning as a freshman to Warren High Alejandra's parents always encouraged her to strive for success. On Saturday, April 15, while on her way to compete against the best students across California for the SkillsUSA State Competition, Alejandra received an email that would change her

"I wish I was with my parents when I read the email, but I was around my friends and SkillsUSA team when I got the news... and all I did was cry," said Alejandra.

Being one of only 300 students across the nation selected out of a pool of 28,700 applicants, Alejandra was made aware that she was chosen to be a Gates Scholar. Attaining this designation meant that she was a member of the Gates Scholarship Inaugural Class of 2018 and joined an elite group of young leaders from across the U.S.

This prestigious scholarship holds." will not only pay for her tuition, but includes all factors that will contribute to her success during her undergraduate years, including fees, housing, books, transportation, health insurance and other various costs.

Alejandra will be attending USC in the fall, double majoring in Human Biology and Spanish, at completely no cost to her or her family. This scholarship will also provide her the opportunity to travel abroad for a semester, have a "Maymester" in Spain (an additional semester in May to study abroad) and a paid internship.

She will be graduating from Warren High on June 1, with a state weighted G.P.A. of 4.92, the second highest in her class. She has competed in the SkillsUSA competitions, making it to the national level three times, and has also been a successful student athlete, playing varsity water polo and swimming all four years at Warren High.

"This scholarship is given to a first-generation college student to support them in advancing their education in STEM [Science, the lives of as many people as Engineering, Technology, fields," Mathematics] stated Warren High School principal Laura Rivas. "We are all so extremely proud of Alejandra and can't wait to see what her future

Alejandra also received additional scholarships at Warren High School's Senior Awards Night Wednesday evening that will also contribute to her education post-graduation. These include scholarships in various denominations from Delta Kappa Gamma, Financial Partners Credit Union, Downey Association of Realtors and others.

With the funds she will be receiving from these various scholarships combined, Alejandra plans to use the remaining money to establish a college fund for her younger sister.

"I know it takes a village, I've seen it here at Warren. I wouldn't have been able to do this without the help of many of my teachers," expressed Alejandra. "And through this scholarship, I hope to continue to do the same for others and influence them to follow their dreams."

Alejandra plans on attending medical school after graduating from USC and becoming a pediatrician.



# Sports betting will complete the gambling revolution

We think of revolutions as sudden, spectacular events, much like earthquakes or erupting volcanoes that transform the landscape overnight. But sometimes they occur so slowly and quietly that it's possible to overlook how much change they bring about.

Over the past generation, the United States has undergone a gambling revolution. A pastime once seen as the sordid province of mobsters, grifters and wastrels has become an all-American form of fun.

Last year, some 81 million people visited casinos — more than the number who attended Major League Baseball games. About half of American adults say they've bought lottery tickets in the past 12 months. Nearly 60 million people in the U.S. and Canada take part in fantasy sports leagues, which often involve money. Gambling is a diversion that effortlessly soars over categories of age, gender, income, race and political party.

Religious objections are not necessarily dispositive. The joke in Utah is: "Catholics don't recognize birth control, Jews don't recognize Jesus, and Mormons don't recognize each other in Nevada."

Evangelical Christians view gambling as an affront to the 10th commandment — "You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his cattle, nor anything that is his." But one of the nation's largest gambling meccas is Biloxi, Mississippi, deep in the Bible Belt. Years ago, former Mississippi Republican Party Chairman Clarke Reed explained, "The attitude is it's really bad but I'm really enjoying it."

The enjoyment endures, and the guilt has been too mild to reverse the growing popularity of various types of wagering. With Monday's Supreme Court decision striking down a federal law that prohibited states from acting to legalize sports betting, the gambling revolution looks close to completion.

I live in the neighboring city district, District 2, but every time I call Mr. Rodriquez, he answers the phone and does his best to address any concern that I bring to him.



The change may not even be apparent to younger Americans, who grew up in a country where casinos, lotteries and racetracks are about as unusual as a Walmart Supercenter. These people may not realize that until 1978, anyone with an urge to patronize a casino had to go to Nevada. In the 1960s, only New Hampshire and New York had state lotteries.

Today, there are casinos (commercial, tribal or both) in 40 states. Lotteries are offered in 44 states and the District of Columbia. We have gone from a strong presumption against legal gambling to a strong presumption in favor of it.

The Supreme Court decision opens the way for states to allow something that has been popular in many places but legal only in Nevada — wagering on actual athletic contests. If this activity were not popular, newspapers and ESPN wouldn't offer betting lines on a raft of professional and college games every day.

This titanic shift didn't occur because Americans abruptly shed their inhibitions. It occurred because states experimented with legal gambling and found the results agreeable, or at least tolerable. Each new venture provided more information — and the more information the public had the more comfortable it became letting people wager with the blessing of the law.

The opponents of legal gambling advised the Supreme Court that if it allowed states to make their own decisions on sports betting, rivers would run red and plagues of locusts would descend upon us. A group of organizations led by Stop Predatory Gambling filed a brief warning that legal sports wagering would "exploit the financially desperate, exacerbate crime, cultivate addiction" and impose "enormous social costs."

But if this were a poker game, these groups would have to fold. Harvard Medical School researchers Howard Shaffer and Ryan Martin have found that despite the explosion of legal gambling options since the 1970s, the incidence of pathological gambling in the U.S. populace has stayed the same — below 1 percent.



The national proliferation of gambling establishments has been accompanied by a sharp decline in the national rates of violent crime and property crime. In 1999, a government-funded commission said the evidence indicated that "communities with casinos are just as safe as communities that do not have casinos." If casinos begin offering action on NFL or NBA games, that's not likely to change.

Legal gambling is not a magic formula for economic prosperity or fiscal health. Nor is it an instrument to destroy communities. It's just another business that provides consumers with something they want at a price they are willing to pay.

Every claim made by opponents of sports betting has been made before about other types of gambling. By now, we know they're bluffing.

# From Russia with love

Robert Mueller's investigation into whether President Donald Trump and the Russians colluded to rig the 2016 presidential election so far has borne little fruit. The Democrats and their media allies would love to find some Russian collusion and interference. I can help them discover some, but I doubt that they will show much interest. Here it goes.

For years, Russia has been the world's largest oil producer. Within recent times, the U.S. has edged Russia out of the No. 1 spot. Much of the increased U.S. production is attributable to hydraulic fracturing, or fracking, in the shale formations in Texas and North Dakota. Now the U.S. is a net exporter of oil. Exports of oil have exceeded oil imports since 2011. This hasn't sat well with Russia, which has taken measures to hinder our oil productivity.

An American Spectator magazine story points to the kind of Russian collusion and domestic meddling that meets the approval of Democrats, leftists and their media allies. The story is aptly titled "Russian funding of U.S. environmental groups shows how collusion is done" (http://tinyurl.com/y897kbt3). A 2014 U.S. Senate Environment and Public Works Committee report identified that the San Francisco-based Sea Change Foundation receives funding from a Bermuda-based shell company known as Klein Ltd. Klein Ltd. was created by attorneys from Wakefield Quin, a law firm that has close ties to Russian President Vladimir Putin. Klein Ltd. operates as a "pass-through" organization for foreign funds going into

Those same 990 forms show that the Sea Change Foundation distributed more than \$20 million in grants in 2010 and 2011 to environmental organizations. It gave more than \$40 million in grants to leftist environmental groups, such as the Natural Resources Defense Council, The Sierra Club Foundation, the League of Conservation Voters Education Fund, the Tides Foundation, the Union of Concerned Scientists and the World Wildlife Fund.

In return for the grant money, those leftist environmentalists were "to promote awareness of climate change," "reduce reliance on high carbon energy," "educate the public about climate and clean energy" and "promote climate and clean energy communications." A U.S. House Science, Space and Technology Committee report, titled "Russian Attempts to Influence U.S. Domestic Energy Markets by Exploiting Social Media," details that the environmental groups used the Russian money to protest the process of fracking and fight the building of the Keystone XL pipeline. If environmentalists can thwart U.S. oil production, Russia, which



is a major energy supplier to Europe, stands to gain greater economic and political power.

. Rep. Lamar Smith, the chairman of the House Science, Space and Technology Committee, has raised the possibility that those complicit in the scheme to use American environmentalists to advance Russian propaganda and interests could be in violation of federal statutes that apply to foreign agents lobbying in behalf of foreign interests.

In the case of natural gas, the Russians didn't have to bribe environmentalists to do their dirty work. They had willing support from U.S. industrial giants such as Dow, Alcoa, Celanese and Nucor, members of America's Energy Advantage. These U.S. companies lobbied against natural gas exports, saying that it would be unpatriotic to allow unlimited natural gas exports.

Export restrictions kept natural gas prices artificially low and gave U.S. manufacturing companies a raw material advantage. The lifting of export restrictions has raised natural gas prices in the U.S. but lowered them in the recipient countries and weakened Russia's economic and political hold on Europe.

In my book, that's a good thing.



# Paging Dr. Frischer...

One of the most difficult, complex, and costly issues of our time is

this nation's opioid epidemic. During 2016, 116 people died every day from opioid-related drug overdoses. That comes to 42,249 deaths for the year. The cost from 2001 through 2017 has been estimated at over a trillion

These drugs stimulate opioid receptors in our nervous system. Opioid receptors regulate pain and reward systems, making opioids powerful painkillers, and also enormously addictive.

The original opioid was opium, a narcotic that comes from a variety of the poppy. From opium came a number of other similar drugs. The first derivative was heroin, followed by Vicodin, Percocet, and OxyContin. In addition, there are man-made compounds that behave like opiates but are not derived from the poppy, including methadone and fentanyl. Collectively, these are known as opiates or opioids.

While opioid addiction goes back centuries, the current crisis started

in the 1980s. The thought back then was that doctors weren't treating pain aggressively enough, and that patients were suffering needlessly. During the 1990s, doctors were required to take continuing medical education classes on pain management. The pharmaceutical industry took note of this, and began aggressively marketing OxyContin and other painkillers. This shift put less emphasis on the obvious concerns about addiction, and more on patient satisfaction and the elimination of pain. Clinics providing opioid prescriptions sprang up all around the country, and as a result, an ever-growing number of people grew addicted.

At the same time, the heroin market was changing. The price plummeted, and drug distribution networks and counterfeit pharmaceuticals became easily available. A ready and willing heroin customer base sprung up from those who had started by taking prescription opiates.

In 2014, fentanyl entered the market. Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid 50 times more potent than heroin. While heroin is derived from a plant that requires fields, labor, and time to grow and harvest, fentanyl is synthetic. It found a useful place in medicine, both as a surgical anesthetic and for the treatment of severe pain, usually in terminal patients. However, almost all of the fentanyl on the streets is illegally manufactured, and smuggled in from China or Mexico.

The vast majority of deaths come from heroin (an illegal drug) and illegally manufactured fentanyl. In 2000, the typical age of death from opioids was age 40. Currently, most deaths occur among those in their

Where do we go from here? Can doctors simply stop prescribing opioids? They are a vital component of modern medicine that has improved the quality of life for millions of people, including cancer patients and those in acute pain. However, new DEA rules have made it more difficult for doctors to prescribe them, and prescriptions for opioids have been declining since 2010. They have become less available to those with chronic pain, where the benefits of opioids are less clear, especially when weighed against the risks of overdose and addiction.

There are no easy solutions to the opioid crisis. We need to carefully control prescription opioids, but maintain access for those with legitimate needs. We need to improve the way our medical system currently manages pain, and insurers should cover more options for pain management, including acupuncture, massage, physical therapy, counseling, hypnosis, and herbal remedies. We need to continue to improve access to and effectiveness of opioid treatment programs for those already addicted.

This is a huge crisis that destroys lives and families, and has no simple or quick solution.

# Hotel swimming pools blamed for disease outbreaks

during 2000 through 2014 occurred in hotel pools or hot tubs, according to a report published last week in CDC's Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report.

Cryptosporidium (also known as "Crypto"), Pseudomonas, and Legionella caused most of the outbreaks in swimming venues in the United States during this time period. Crypto is a parasite tough enough to survive even in properly maintained pools. Pseudomonas and Legionella are bacteria that can survive disinfectants in slimy areas of hot tubs, pools, and water playgrounds.

The report describes mixed progress in preventing outbreaks caused by germs spread through treated recreational water. The 493 outbreaks reported during this period resulted in at least 27,219 illnesses and eight deaths.

The number of respiratory disease outbreaks caused by Legionella increased over time and skin infection outbreaks caused by Pseudomonas decreased over time.

Diarrheal disease outbreaks caused by Cryptosporidium leveled off during 2008 through 2014. More than half of outbreaks started in the summer, the peak season for swimming.

#### Common parasite remains the leading cause of illness from pools

Crypto causes 58 percent of outbreaks where a germ was identified linked to pools, hot tubs, and water playgrounds and 89 percent of the illnesses. Crypto spreads in pools when someone sick with the parasite has diarrhea in the water and other swimmers swallow that contaminated water. Swimmers and parents of young swimmers play an essential role in preventing Crypto outbreaks.

"Swallowing just a mouthful of water with Crypto in it can make otherwise healthy kids and adults sick for weeks with watery

A third of treated recreational R.N., M.P.H., chief of CDC's Healthy waterborne disease outbreaks Swimming Program. "Chlorine cannot kill Crypto quickly. We need to keep it out of the water in the first place. Don't go into the water, and don't let your kids go into the water, if sick with diarrhea."

#### **Bacteria cause respiratory illness** and skin rashes

The bacteria Legionella and Pseudomonas are the next most leading causes of these outbreaks, with 16 percent of outbreaks caused by Legionella and 13 percent caused by Pseudomonas. Legionella can cause severe pneumonia and symptoms similar to the flu. Pseudomonas can cause hot tub rash and swimmer's ear.

If a pool, hot tub, or water playground is not cleaned properly, bacteria can grow and form a slime called biofilm on wet surfaces. Legionella and Pseudomonas can live in this biofilm. It is harder for disinfectants to kill these bacteria when they are protected by biofilm.

Pool operators need to maintain proper cleaning practices and disinfectant levels to prevent bacteria from growing and causing illnesses in swimmers. CDC provides specific recommendations for operating public pools, hot tubs and water playgrounds in the Model Aquatic Health Code.

Some people are more likely to get sick from Legionella, including people 50 years or older, current or former smokers, people with chronic lung disease, and people with a weakened immune system.

These people should see a doctor right away if they develop pneumonia symptoms and let the doctor know about any possible exposures to Legionella, including recent hot tub use.



It would be generally bounded within parcels on the north side of Burns Avenue, parcels on the west side of La Reina Avenue, parcels on the west side of Brookshire Avenue, and parcels on the north side of 3rd Street / New Street / 4th Street and the parcels fronting the east side of Downey Avenue between 3rd and 4th Street, excluding the undeveloped parcels east of US Bank, but including City Hall.

The city owns property within the new district, which spurred concerns from Mayor Sean Ashton as to how the CBD might be perceived amongst other business owners within the area.

"We're 18 percent of it technically, but I don't think we're doing this for us to control it," said Ashton. "I want to make sure that if these people are volunteering to be part of this, they're the ones that have the say as to how the money is spent. That's my big concern...They're going to have the say since it's their money; they're gonna have the say as to how it's spent."

Council member Alex Saab tried to quell the mayor's worries by clarifying the intent of the CBD.

"The idea is not for the city to control this, because it defeats the whole purpose," said Saab. "The idea of this is who knows more about the downtown district than the businesses themselves?

In an interview Wednesday, former mayor and business owner Kirk Cartozian said that he "tends to trust" the process, saying that "it's worked very well in a lot of cities."

However, he emphasized that it must be done right. Cartozian is one of the owners of the former Avenue Theater property, which falls within the boundaries of the potential CBD.

"It has to be implemented properly," said Cartozian. "You need a board or body to make decisions for the benefit of the businesses."

Council members voted unanimously in favor of the district at Tuesday's meeting, with Councilmember Fernando Vasquez abstaining. Vasquez owns property within the projected new district.

Staff will now mail out ballots to each property owner within the district, with votes cast returned to the City Clerk.

Votes will be tabulated at a public hearing that is scheduled for July 24.



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


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
