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Recent tremblors a reminder to be prepared

ecent earthquakes impacted a city more than 150 miles from Downey, but it was a rude awakening for many of our residents. If there's an earthquake, don't forget to do the following:

- Drop down; take cover under a desk/table and hold on during an earthquake. Stay away from windows, bookcases and other furniture that can fall on you. Avoid doorways.
- If outside, stay in an area that is clear from buildings, trees and powerlines.
- If you are in a vehicle, pull over and stop. Set your parking brake.

• Before an earthquake, look around your house for items that can fall over. Secure large furniture and appliances to the wall, or mount items that can break

• Know how to turn off your gas and water to prevent a second emergency

Family and friends have asked me what they can do to prepare, and I say-- you CAN start with a CAN!

Emergency preparedness does not have to be an expensive venture; pick up a can of soup, fruit, vegetable, or spam each time you grocery shop to build your emergency supply.

Your goal should be selfsufficiency for at least 2 weeks, but ideally a month. Here are some tips to consider.

- Upcycle used backpacks and tennis shoes for your emergency kits.
- Shop at your local discount store for basic supplies such as first aid kits, snacks, and water bottles.
- One gallon of water, per person, per day.
- Car and office go-kit should have 1-day supplies, and a go-luggage should have 7-day supplies if you need to evacuate your home.
- Some emergency food is dryer than cardboard but can last a few years. Some canned water can last decades.
- Pack cash in your emergency kits; especially small bills. Stores may not have change for you during emergencies and the credit card machines may be out of order.
- Consider your needs and those you love-- pets, medication, spare glasses, etc.
- Pack family photos. It's comforting during a stressful time, but also very helpful if you need a photo of a family member who has gone missing. Don't forget pictures of your pets as well!
- Compile important documents in one folder. Documents may include: marriage/birth certificates, trusts, insurance, mortgage, medical documents, etc. Store it in your go-luggage.
- Consider insurance for earthquake, flood, etc.

Fireworks blamed for 8 fires on Fourth of July

DOWNEY - Downey firefighters responded to 32 emergency incidents on July 4, including eight small fires suspected to have been caused by fireworks.

The fires were minor in severity, said Fire Chief Mark Gillaspie. They ranged from a wood shake roof that ignited to dumpster and vegetation fires.

"The fire department also responded to similar type fires between July 2 to July 7," said Gillaspie. "Fortunately, no fireworks-related injuries were reported."

The Downey Police Department issued 54 citations for illegal fireworks between 7 p.m. and 1 a.m. on July 4.

On Race, Housing and Confronting History

In the first of a 7-part series, Stanford University graduate Aron Ramirez examines the complicated narrative of Downey's demographic change.

In the span of 10 years, Downey transformed from a white middle-class suburb into a Mexican American middle-class suburb. Perhaps the more accurate statement to make, though, would be that between 1985 and 1995 the demographic makeup shifted.

Indeed, there was little that made Downey a Mexican American suburb—save for the residents' surnames. Unlike most contemporary Latino/a/x-majority communities throughout metropolitan Los Angeles, there were no panaderías, tortillerías, or supermercados. English was spoken in public, even between two Spanish-speaking individuals.

The demographic makeup had changed in the 1990s, but the character remained the same. Middle-class Mexican Americans flocked to Downey in the late 1980s and early 1990s to access the reputable school district, responsive police and fire departments, and secure property investments. Indeed, middle-class Mexican Americans moved to Downey for many of the same reasons that white residents did in the 1950s and 1960s. The demographic change would transform Downey from a white middle-class suburb to a city mentioned in 2015 by the Los Angeles Times as the "Mexican Beverly Hills." It is that history that I will present to the community over the next seven

(A note on terminology: In these essays, I'll use Latino/a/x to refer to those descendant of immigrants from Mexico, Caribbean, and Central and South American countries. The o/a/x signals modern sensibilities toward inclusivity without omitting the contemporary usage of o/a in spoken and written Spanish. Latino/a/x is a general term which I use when I cannot specify between destinations of origin. It has a political history that I publicly recognize and personally reckon with; nonetheless, I use it here in its contemporary forms. Otherwise, I use Mexican Americans to refer to American citizens or residents of Mexican ancestry.

I refer to Mexican Americans and immigrants together as Mexican-origin, especially in cases with heterogeneous citizenship statuses. I use Anglo and white interchangeably to refer to populations of white Americans of Anglo-Saxon descent.)

I chose to write these essays for two reasons. For one, I believe in the practice of public history. It is one thing to write community histories for the Ivory Tower with little regard for non-academic audiences. It is altogether another to share the findings with the

community in question.

This is made easier by my second reason: the Mexican American suburbanization in Downey presents historical anomalies that upend common conclusions about demographic change in southeast Los Angeles. From the 1920s until the Watts Riots of 1965, nearby suburbs like Compton, Huntington Park, and South Gate were home to white working-and-middle-class residents.

Throughout southeast Los Angeles, white residents ranged from 87 to 99 percent of census tract populations. After the Watts Riots, white families with the financial means left in droves—what we now call "white flight"—changing the demographic and economic landscape of the suburbs they fled. White flight involved more than demographic change, as these families dramatically altered the tax revenues collected by cities.

1970s then hit southeast Los Angeles especially hard. Cities that relied on manufacturing revenues to fund civic infrastructures found themselves operating on anemic budgets. A subsequent "War on Crime" led to renewed conflicts between police and suspected gang members. Compton, for example, took an especially strong stance and dedicated disproportionate percentages of city budgets toward increased policing, which left streets unmaintained, schools underfunded, and other city functions un-serviced.

In truth, larger structural forces like deindustrialization, the end of the Cold War, a waning military-industrial complex, and tax base restructuring caused much of the changing quality of life in the nearby suburbs. Capital flight accompanied white flight, and by the 1980s, the white-majority working-to-middle-class suburbs of southeast Los Angeles were minority-majority working-poor cities.

Except in Downey. There was no widespread white flight from Downey after the Watts Riots. Demographic change in this city did not happen until a 1988 housing boom made selling homes profitable for the white majority. Second, through demographic transformation, Downey's Mexican American plurality upheld the middle-class reputation—the built and lived environment, the schools and

the homes, the streets and the sidewalks—in ways unlike the surrounding suburbs. It is this last anomaly that I narrate in these essays.

Part of understanding this history, though, requires grappling with uncomfortable topics. For all the victors in this history—as in most histories—there are the displaced, the divided, the discriminated. We often prefer to glide over these uncomfortable topics. Our histories, we think, should be conversations safe for the dinner table. It is far easier to talk of revolutions, presidents, and laws.

Today, fewer are wont to opt for a sanitized history of what may otherwise seem like mundane historical relics; many now want to consider what a statue meant to many groups in post-Civil-War America, not only to some. Two weeks ago, we considered multiple public meanings of Betsy Ross's flag. I think historical inquiry would be remiss if it didn't uncover and unravel these difficult topics. By restoring the histories of those who are seldom spoken of—and, therefore, by complicating those who are revered—we can restore dignity to the undignified. We can revive the forgotten. We can give full justice to the historical record.

I did not write this (at times uncomfortable) history out of hate or any agenda, but rather out of love. To recognize the complexity of Downey's demographic transformation is to move beyond a good-bad reductionist oversimplification. Doing so makes it possible—however uncomfortable—to love the city for all that it is, both its success stories and displacement narratives.

This history differs from most others about demographic change and displacement. The principal displacers and displaced are Mexican Americans. The middle-class Mexican Americans who formed the core of Downey's (admittedly diverse) community in the 1990s, and therefore today, deserve credit for their navigation of economic uncertainties in the face of demographic flux. That the city today remains the "Oasis," as I remember hearing it called, owes to the home-owning customs and practices of Downey's middleclass Mexican Americans.



Downey's Mexican Americans, however, were not always exceptionally wealthy. In the 1950s, the city's Mexican American population was as working-class as their counterparts throughout metropolitan Los Angeles by nearly every economic measure. Nearly 300 adult Mexican-origin residents lived in Downey homes. All but ten of the working Mexican-origin residents—men and women—worked in low-skill or semi-skilled blue-collar jobs. Twenty were listed in the City Directory as "laborer," likely in the unspecified role of a handyman. Eleven were truck drivers, nine worked in factories, six on farms, and another six were given the pejorative term "scavenger," a label for someone who collected and recycled scrap metals. Twenty-two males were listed as unemployed, and most females stayed at home.

Only ten Mexican Americans worked in low-white-collar jobs: four were labeled clerks and five were salespeople. One was a veterinary surgeon. Low levels of postsecondary educational achievement limited the upward economic mobility for Mexican Americans in Downey.

The economic makeup of Downey's Mexican Americans in 1950 affected their housing situations. The 297 working Mexican Americans and their families crowded into 126 unique addresses, only 18 of which were located outside a barrio bounded by Firestone Boulevard to the north, Imperial Highway to the south, Lakewood Boulevard to the East, and Downey Avenue to the west. About 122 Mexican-origin families in 1950 owned their homes, 4 rented from a white homeowner, and the other 171 families lived with the home-owning families.

The map below shows the density of families in central Downey streets and neighborhoods. In short, most Mexican Americans were residentially segregated into a barrio in central Downey.

This discrimination was made possible by the real estate appraisal system of the Home Owners' Loan Corporation (HOLC). To incentivize homeownership during the Great Depression, the Roosevelt Administration enacted federal programs to offer and insure home mortgages. HOLC and the Federal Housing Administration (FHA) were the two principal bodies for facilitating homeownership in the 1930s and 1940s. HOLC used a four-tiered color code to denote investment risk for federal mortgages: green for the best, purple for good, yellow for fair, and red for risky (which was almost always reserved for areas where ethnic minorities lived).

In 1939, HOLC appraised neighborhoods in Downey. A central-north neighborhood received a yellow grade because of the small presence of Japanese and Mexican field workers, who were "a detrimental influence." Elsewhere in Downey, developers used race-restrictive covenants to protect the neighborhoods from similar "undesirable" elements. This meant that home deeds in certain tracts, such as the Orange Estates, specifically prohibited homeowners from reselling their properties to Mexican American or Black homeowners regardless of economic background.

In 1948, the United States Supreme Court ruled in Shelley v. Kraemer that race-restrictive covenants were legally unenforceable—not illegal. Realtors in Downey and across the United States adapted: in place of the explicit racial discrimination, deeds came to prohibit resale that would threaten the integrity and property values of the neighborhood. Property values, though, were determined in large part by the insurance maps created by HOLC and private companies who imitated the practice. This system of residential segregation created "red-lining."

Red-lining and race-restrictive covenants help explain the small number of Mexican-origin families that lived outside the barrio. Some lighter-complected Mexican Americans probably passed as "Spanish," as one historian suggested happened elsewhere. But for Mexican Americans without light-skin privilege, it was generally hard to break into select neighborhoods of the self-advertised "White Spot of Southeast Los Angeles" (see below). The barrio was, like the segregated neighborhoods throughout metropolitan Los Angeles, a racialized space. Mexican Americans expressed their Mexican identities freely, but it was an area the city neglected. Roads remained unpaved well into the 1950s and 1960s, incomes remained lower in the barrio than elsewhere in Downey, and the Mexican Americans living there had a reputation among Downey whites for being rowdy and criminally-inclined.

One contemporary resident said of the Mexican American barrio boys: "You would see them at the restaurants or at the Coke place. Everybody knew who they were. But you never did see a gang of them, just a few at a time."

Of course, the "rough" neighborhoods also lagged in economic measures and housing quality. But this area was a bastion of Mexican

Courtesy of the Downey Historical Society. culture, with weekly quinceañeras, a preponderance of Spanglish, and vibrant fiestas. Bob Thompson recalled fond memories of going to his friends' houses in the barrio and picking up Spanglish words while eating home-cooked Mexican food. Despite the lack of economic capital and resources, the central Downey barrio was rich in Mexican culture.

The first generations of Mexican Americans in Downey were, on the whole, low-wage workers, undereducated, and lived in segregated neighborhoods; this was representative of most other Mexican Americans in Californian urban centers. Through education, entrepreneurship, or a combination of both, Mexican Americans in Downey and throughout southeast Los Angeles would climb the socioeconomic ladder and eventually plan their own moves to the very neighborhoods their predecessors found off-limits.

In the 1980s and 1990s, the same "property values" framework that informed residential segregation would guide the community through demographic transformation. Indeed, suburban racism was not informed by a fear of melanin on its own, but rather by nonverbal information communicated through the physical appearance of Blacks and Mexican Americans. Suburban racists supported exclusion and segregation because they feared that a Mexican (or Black, or Asian, or any minority) neighbor would comport themselves in accordance to the intergenerational stereotypes and ideas about those groups. Race-restrictive covenants operated on the assumption that a Mexican American neighbor would bring gangs and drugs to the neighborhood, or would change their motor oil on the front lawn, or would otherwise sully the customs and practices that kept neighborhood property values high.

The use of racial ideology explains why white residents could profess to not be racist, so long as their neighbors mowed their lawns, were family-oriented and the like. Suburban racism, exemplified by segregation and race-restrictive covenants, allowed white residents to minimize what they felt were the risks of living near a group of people with different politics, home-owning practices, religious beliefs, language preferences, or interests. With little sustained inter-group interaction—which would have been the norm and not the exception in race-restricted suburban communities—white homeowners scarcely challenged these generalizations and passed them down as knowledge.

But this ideology assumed that minority groups necessarily held different political opinions, home-owning practices, religious beliefs, language preferences, or interests. The middle-class Mexican Americans of Downey challenged these assumptions. It is how they first became Downeyites and how they later upheld the middle-class reputation.

Over the next six issues, I will unfold the complicated narrative of Downey's demographic change. I present a narrative to suggest that at each stage of transformation, Downey's middle-class Mexican Americans prioritized their civic identity—their belonging in the Downey community—over their ethnic identities. In next week's installment, I will examine the permanence of the white demographic majority in Downey long after the Watts Riots before discussing the role of Spanish-speaking realtors in moving the first middle-class Mexican Americans into the formerly restricted neighborhoods.

Those pioneering Mexican Americans secured their place in Downey—and the suburban privileges that came with it—by portraying an assimilated civic identity; the third installment of this series will focus on one key aspect of the civic identity, English speaking in public. This is not to suggest that Mexican Americans simply dropped all expressions of their Mexican heritage; the fourth essay will discuss what I call "metropolitan Mexicanness," which helped many residents pursue the practices and customs important to their heritage without undermining their assimilated civic identity in Downey.

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Downey's history with race and housing

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Despite Mexican American efforts to emphasize their "Americanness," the sheer rapidity of demographic change frightened some of the remaining white residents into overestimating the cultural differences between themselves and their new neighbors. The early 1990s witnessed race-based tensions, which I focus on in the fifth

In the sixth essay, I detail the homeowning practices and customs of the new Mexican American plurality in the 1990s to suggest that despite the change in demographics, homeowning in Downey mostly remained the same. Residents' surnames changed, but property values remained high. The series concludes with the darker side of this story when antiimmigrant sentiment found fertile soil among the "property-values"-minded residents—Mexican American or otherwise.

Of course, I do not purport this interpretation to be authoritative. By sharing my ideas with this readership, I feel that I may return this community history to its rightful owners. But I anticipate pushback, especially from those who lived and acted in the times I can only interpret through the archives. I welcome this vulnerability. Should the spirit touch you, I implore you to share your own documentbased interpretations. (Memory, while precious, is malleable and

Downey set to celebrate 50th anniversary of moon landing

A series of events are planned this summer at the Space Center to commemorate the U.S.'s first landing on the moon.



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Things You Didn't Know About Downey

The Life of Lemuel Carpenter

Kentucky could relate.

He settled in marriage to an Indian girl named Espiritu. She died after the birth of their second child.

Sometime after that, Carpenter moved his factory to the Santa Gertrudes side of the river. Evidently, he was a welcome guest at the social affairs at Los Nietos. No doubt he was a lively one as well. The fiestas, the horseracing, the dancing was something to which a young man from the blue-grass country of

emuel Carpenter made soap on the riverbank at Jaboneria.

At one of these affairs his hostess, Josefa Cota Nieto, widow of Manuel and owner of Rancho Santa Gertrudes, introduced him to her niece, Maria De Los Angeles Dominguez. A short time later they were married. Five children were born to them.

Carpenter had breached a family and cultural barrier. More Anglo-Saxon culture would eventually dominate the pastoral Spanish culture of California, but Lemuel Carpenter would have no hand in it. By nature and by inclination he easily accepted the California way of life as though born to it. He lived the pleasant life of a Don, and when the two cultures clashed, he was destroyed along with

In 1843, he purchased Rancho Santa Gertrudes from the widow Josefa Cota Nieto, his wife's aunt, for \$4,000. He spent an additional \$5,000 in making the estate a show place for gracious but costly living.

He raced fast horses. He took a hand in cards. He involved himself in the turmoil of California politics. As with all owners of ranchos, he was almost constantly involved in boundary litigation. He laid claim to 24,000 acres but this was reduced to somewhat less than 20,000 acres by successful litigation of several other claimants

The most interesting of these claimants was one Bernardino Guirado, storekeeper at Los Nietos, who would become a brother-

in-law to a man named John Gately Downey. Possibly the widow Nieto had deeded some land to the storekeeper for a long overdue bill. Money was a scarce commodity in early California.

Carpenter had only four years to establish himself as a Don when a motley crew of soldiers and sailors from the United States marched through his ranch and changed the whole California picture.

This was Gen. Stephen Watts Kearny's Army of the East in conjunction with Commodore Robert Field Stockton's blue jackets of the Pacific fleet who marched from San Diego to Los Angeles to win California for the United States.

One of the few skirmishes of the war was fought near the northwest corner of the ranch. It is known as the Battle of the San Gabriel. A bronze plaque with two cannons indicate the spot at Bluff Road and Washington Boulevard, near the Washington Bridge over the Rio Hondo River. (Dwight L. Clarke puts the scene closer to the Whittier Boulevard crossing.)

The Mexican War put the Americans in California in a difficult position. To marry and hold land in California, they first had to become Mexican citizens.

Carpenter seems to have survived the suspicion of double loyalty. His friendship with Pio Pico may have eased him through this delicate period. Some of his fellow Americans were imprisoned.

United States troops occupied Carpenter's ranch house for a short period, but the cessation of California to the United States by Mexico in the peace treaty which ended the war stabilized the political situation for the first time in many years.

Carpenter was able to resume his life as an anglocized Don. This change lasted briefly. New money came into the state, probably too much money. The Dons who had prospered on a barter economy found credit very easy. Their large holdings provided plenty of security. They borrowed heavily but only to bolster their old way of living. They failed to develop the riches of their resources.

Eventually, when payment was due, most of them went under. Lemuel Carpenter went right under with them.

In 1852, he borrowed \$5,000 from John Gately Downey. That was a start. By 1859, he was in debt to an estimated \$104,000. On Nov. 9, 1859, the ranch was auctioned by the sheriff to satisfy his creditors.

Carpenter was not there. He had put a bullet through his head.

The buyers of Rancho Santa Gertrudes were John Gately Downey and James McFarland. They paid \$60,000 for the 17,602 acres. In that same year, Downey was elected lieutenant governor of California.

Paging Dr. Frischer...

ot a day goes by in my medical practice that I'm not asked about CBD.

CBD is one of the compounds from the cannabis plant. It is

very popular and people choose to use it for a large variety of health issues, including pain management, arthritis, insomnia, anxiety, depression, Parkinson's

insomnia, anxiety, depression, Parkinson's disease, headaches, smoking cessation, various neuropsychiatric and neurodegenerative disorders, cancer, type 1 diabetes, acne, dementia, and epilepsy (more on epilepsy below).

If CBD can effectively treat all of these issues, it will truly be amazing.

The cannabis plant contains CBD, THC, and 120 other compounds as well. These compounds have very different effects. THC has been the best

known of them and is the most active ingredient in marijuana. Over the years, marijuana farmers have selectively bred plants to contain high levels of THC. Hemp farmers, on the other hand, have rarely modified the plant, and it is these hemp plants that are used to create CBD products.

I find it fascinating that our body also produces its own natural cannabinoids. We have receptors throughout our body, including the brain, which bind to different cannabinoid compounds. Various cannabinoid compounds can even alter the levels of our own "naturally" produced cannabinoids.

CBD, unlike THC, is not psychoactive – it does not affect our state of mind. Nonetheless, it does produce significant changes in the body.

At this time, there is only one FDA approved use for CBD. In 2018, the prescription use of Epidiolex, a purified form of CBD oil, was approved for the treatment of some types of epilepsy. Epidiolex has had extensive scientific testing and evaluation.

What about all of the other possible uses for CBD? At this time, only preliminary studies have been conducted, and many are promising. So far, it appears that CBD causes no significant side effects on the central nervous system, vital signs, or mood. The most common side effects are tiredness, diarrhea and reduced appetite. Note that no addiction or dependency has been seen in CBD users.

At this time, cannabis products, whether CBD or THC based, are legal for medicinal and recreational use in California. However, their legality varies from state to state, and is in conflict with federal law. It is, at best, confusing for now.

Be aware that CBD comes in a variety of forms and in various doses. That, along with the lack of conclusive studies, makes it very difficult to give educated recommendations about its use. Still, it is clear that many preliminary studies show a lot of promise. When I compare it to, for example, high dose, potentially addictive narcotics for pain, or potentially addictive benzodiazepines for anxiety, CBD appears to be far safer. I remain open minded.

I encourage you to have a discussion with your doctor if you are considering giving CBD a try.

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It's time to pay women soccer players equally as men

It is difficult to understand the argument that the United States women's national soccer team should get paid just as much as the men's national soccer team.

The women are much more successful. They should earn

On Sunday, the 23 women selected to represent the United States at the 2019 World Cup triumphed over the Netherlands to complete a dominating run to victory. It is the second straight time the United States has won the quadrennial tournament.

During the celebrations, fans chanted "equal pay," highlighting the fact that the United States Soccer Federation, which employs the members of the men's and women's national teams, has long paid larger sums to the men. Megan Rapinoe, honored as the World Cup's top scorer and best player, used her moment in the spotlight to call on United States Soccer to "set things right for the future" by giving the women's team a raise.

Ms. Rapinoe and her teammates have also gone to court, suing the federation in March for gender discrimination. The allegations extend beyond pay. The suit says United States Soccer also invests less in the team's practice facilities, travel arrangements and medical

It is an embarrassment that United States Soccer has failed to address this injustice, allowing the joy of Sunday's celebrations to be tainted by

Pay comparisons are complicated because the men's and women's teams have separately negotiated contracts. Members of the women's team are paid by the federation to play in the National Women's Soccer League, on top of which they receive payments for playing for the national team. The men just get national team payments.

Under the current contract for the women's team, which took effect in April 2017, the women and the men would earn the same amount if both national teams played 20 games — and lost all 20 games. With each victory, however, the men's team would enjoy a larger advantage.

The women can earn more in a given year, as they are likely to do this year. But th is only because they achieved so much. For comparable success, the women get less.

Much of the debate about the pay gap has focused on revenue. Officials have argued that the men's team should simply be regarded as a more successful business.

Even by this measure, there is a case that the women are being wronged. It is not clear, for example, how United States Soccer treats sponsorships that cover both teams.

But revenue is the wrong measuring stick. United States Soccer is a nonprofit, exempted from taxation because it serves a social purpose: "To make soccer, in all its forms, a pre-eminent sport in the United States.' It should be obvious to the people who run the federation that the women's team is

fulfilling that mission at least as well as the men's team.

> The women's soccer team, like other national teams, also represents the United States. The women who wear the nation's colors are ambassadors on an international stage. Their performances inform perceptions of the United States. Millions of people around the world watched on Sunday as a team of strong and skillful women played a game with determination and sportsmanship, and then celebrated freely.

The federation is making a statement about America by treating those women as second-class citizens. It has an opportunity to make a very different statement by rectifying the situation. Players should get the same rewards for achievements, without regard to gender.

The World Cup presents a special challenge because much of the money comes from FIFA, the international organization that stages the tournament and disburses the proceeds of its television deals and corporate sponsorships to the national federations. The pot of money for the men's World Cup is larger than the women's pot.

The women earned bonuses of \$37,500 for making the 2019 World Cup team, while the men could have earned \$68,750 for making the 2018 World Cup Team — if the team had qualified.

FIFA, too, should be held accountable for moving toward gender equity. But there is no need to wait. United States Soccer could make a powerful statement by equalizing these payments, too.

And the men's national team wants to help. In 2017, Norway agreed to equalize pay for its men's and women's national soccer teams. To make the deal possible, the men's team agreed to share its sponsorship revenues. Admirably, it agreed to earn less as a matter of principle. The union representing the American men's national team has endorsed this concept.

Pay gaps are a persistent problem in American society. The case of the national soccer teams is merely an unusually clear and public example of the issue. United States Soccer and its 28 female players suing for gender discrimination have agreed to enter mediation in the hopes of resolving the players' lawsuit. The federation now has the opportunity to create its own clear and public example — by finally doing the right thing.

Illegal fireworks

Dear Editor:

For the past several years I have contacted the Downey Police Department about illegal fireworks on the 4th of July in my neighborhood. They have never followed up on my complaint.

The LAPD reported 8,204 complaints about illegal fireworks in 2017. I don't have access to the figures in Downey, but I assume the number is significant.

I delivered a letter to the Chief of Police this year before the 4th hoping to be proactive and, hopefully, get some attention to the problem this year. In addition, I called in three addresses in my neighborhood on the evening of the 4th that were setting off illegal fireworks. Nothing was done.

I am copying my letter to the Chief of Police herein. The statistics I list in the letter are from unknown sources on the internet and so may not be 100% accurate. I included them to hopefully draw attention to the dangers of illegal fireworks.

Dear Chief Milligan:

I am writing this letter out of frustration. For the past several years, illegal fireworks have been set off at several locations within a block of my house. I have notified the Downey Police Department each year, but have been ignored. As a consequence, the people who traditionally set off these fireworks feel they have tacit approval from the Downey Police and, undoubtedly, will continue with their Lorena Munoz dangerous pyrotechnic displays this year.

Research has shown that illegal fireworks cause around 20,000 fires each year. I have found burned out rockets in my own backyard. These rockets were set off several blocks from my house. I don't feel that my neighbors or I should have to worry that our property might go up in flames because there are no consequences for setting off illegal fireworks in Downey.

Adding to the argument against ignoring these illegal displays is the fact that about 9,300 serious injuries are caused by fireworks each year. To become a licensed pyro technician, one must obtain clearance through the Federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Fireworks. Professional, legal fireworks shows are held throughout the area during the 4th of July holiday. People should attend those and enjoy them—without breaking the law and creating dangerous Josh Forsythe



Ross Perot, former presidential candidate, dies at 89

as a third-party candidate, has died. He was 89.

Perot, whose 19% of the vote in 1992 stands among the best showings by an independent candidate in the past century, died early Tuesday at his home in Dallas surrounded by his devoted family, family spokesman James Fuller said.

As a boy in Texarkana, Texas, Perot delivered newspapers from the back of a pony. He earned his billions in a more modern way, however companies manage their computer networks.

Yet the most famous event in his career didn't involve sales and earnings; he financed a private commando raid in 1979 to free two EDS employees who were being held in a prison in Iran. The tale was turned into a book and a movie.

Perot first became known to Americans outside of business circles by claiming that the U.S. government left behind hundreds of American soldiers who were missing or imprisoned at the end of the Vietnam War. Perot fanned the issue at home and discussed it privately with Vietnamese officials in the 1980s, angering the Reagan administration, which was formally negotiating with Vietnam's government.

Perot's wealth, fame and confident prescription for the nation's economic ills propelled his 1992 campaign against President George





Now he was able to pay them back. He bought them a bigger home, along with one for Gracie. For the best friends he ever had!


When the crew of "This Is

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It's almost time for high school football

DOWNEY – The Downey High School football program is getting ready for the start of the 2019 football season.

The Vikings have 11 games currently scheduled. Downey will travel to Corona del Mar on August 23rd and will follow that up by traveling to Hawai'i to play Kapolei on August 30. The Vikings will then host Locke of Los Angeles at Downey on September 6th in their third game.

Downey will then host Escalon at Downey on September 13th, will host Alemany at Downey on September 20th and will travel to the College of the Canyons to play Hart on September 27th. The game against Hart will mark the end of preseason play and the beginning of San Gabriel Valley League play a week later.

Last season, the Vikings were defeated by Santa Margarita at Trabuco Hills 59-21 in their first game on August 16th. Downey then defeated Hart at Downey 33-21 in their second game on August 24th and were then defeated by Kapolei of Hawai'i at Downey 23-14 in their third preseason game on August 31st.

Downey then defeated San Pedro at San Pedro 52-21 in their fourth game on September 7th and were defeated by Alemany at Alemany 20-14 in their fifth and final preseason game on September 14th. The Vikings finished last season's preseason schedule with a record of 2-3.

Downey will begin San Gabriel Valley League play this fall when they travel to Gahr to play the Gladiators on October 4th. The Vikings will then host Paramount at Downey on October 11th in their second league game.

Downey will then travel to Dominguez to play the Dons on October 18th. The Vikings will then host Lynwood at Downey on October 25th and conclude their regular season schedule when they host cross-town rival Warren at Downey on November

The Vikings were defeated last season by Paramount at Paramount 33-7 on September 28th in their first league game. Downey defeated Dominguez at Downey 56-20 on October 5th, defeated Lynwood at Lynwood 28-0 on October 12th, were defeated by Warren at Warren 48-28 on October 19th and defeated Gahr at Downey 42-27 on October 25th in their fifth and final league game. Downey finished league play last season with a record of 3-2.

The Vikings finished last season with an overall record of 6-6 and were third in league play behind eventual league champion Paramount (5-0) and Warren (4-1), respectively.

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In Memory of

Guido Ugo Acquistapace December 28, 1930 - June 20, 2019



Guido was born in the Florence District of Los Angeles, where he worked in the family auto repair business. In 1941 he moved to Guido Ruffoni's dairy farm in Santa Maria, where he learned to milk cows and tend crops. He was drafted into the Army in 1943 and was stationed in Fort Munroe in Hampton, VA. He worked mainly in the motor pool. After coming

down with the flu (from a flu vaccine) prior to shipping out to Japan, he was kept back at the base. In 1948 he used his benefits from the GI Bill to enroll at L.A. Trade Technical School where he studied auto repair.

In the years after graduation he spent a short time selling real estate and automobiles for Downey Dodge. In 1956 he married Miriam Martin from Orville, OH and began a family. Their first child was Theresa Marie, followed by Thomas Michael and Timothy Mark. A chance meeting with a customer gained him an interview at North American Aviation (later Rockwell International), where he worked on a variety of important projects regarding the exploration of space, the Apollo Missions, experimental spacecraft and flight simulation laboratories for the Space Shuttle.

In 1980 he had heart bypass surgery and his son Tim got him into cycling as a form of recovery, and he enjoyed the sport for over 40 years. In 1998 he and 3 other cyclists (all in their 70s) competed in the Race Across America and won their division, crossing the US in a record time of 8 days, 9 hrs & 11 mins. He spent the final years of his career at the Rockwell plant in Seal Beach. Guido was never sedentary in retirement; he kept riding with his friends in the SCOR cycling club and organizing rides across the state.

He is survived by his wife Miriam of 63 years and his sons Tom and Tim.. A vigil was held yesterday for Guido at Risher Mortuary in Montebello and a mass will take place today at 10:00 AM at Our Lady of Perpetual Help. Downey man launches Camture, a new social media app

Camture is a photo-sharing app, but unlike Instagram, 'likes" are hidden.

DOWNEY - Downey resident Aaron Gallo was observing his niece one day, when he noticed something that he found a bit disturbing.

"She signed up for Musical.ly, and she only got a couple of likes, said Gallo. "She was telling me, 'I feel bad. I didn't get any likes.' She was even going to delete the app.

Seeing a problem, Gallo started working on his own app: Camture.

The app is solving a real-world problem that has to do with social media," said Gallo. "Everybody's really big on numbers; everybody's really big on likes count, followers count, following count. This app is solving that problem."

Gallo says that dozens of apps can be found on the app store that will allow social media users to "buy fake likes and fake followers.

"There's even subscriptions," said Gallo. "People sign up \$9.99 a month to boost their followers. It's fake. It's fake numbers. It's a big popularity contest on Twitter, Instagram, even Facebook."

On Camture, the likes, views, and likewise that are so common on other social media platforms are



hidden; only the user themselves can view their personal app statistics.

numbers "still count," but it is done in a fun way.

"You're ranking up in the app," said Gallo. "You start off as a yellow banana, and the more followers, likes and comments, you evolve through the app to a golden monkey."

"There's still a reason for the likes, followers, and comments, but it's more of a ranking system.

Gallo added that as users progress up the ranks, they will unlock new features.

If you're wondering what the difference is between a ranking system and the number of likes on a photo, Gallo has an answer: it's all about the directness.

"Numbers are really direct," said Gallo. "If you have one like and 1000, that's a really direct number as opposed to having a yellow banana and an orange banana. It's not so in your face with every little photo you put."

Symphony's 60th year ends with a barbecue

ur 60th year ends - and our next 60 begin," said Don Marshall, of president Symphonic Downey Society. With its summertime barbecue, the Guild and the Society ended the year's festivities in style.

At a companion piece to the year-end Pops in the Park concert at twilight on June 26, symphonic music lovers treated themselves on Sunday to a grand finale dinner in the elegant Downey Women's Club.

The afternoon venue, with its sparkling brass chandeliers and bright felt place decorations bookended the glamorous opening reception of a year ago on the stage at the Downey Theatre, when many of the same crowd enjoyed hors d'oeuvres, cheese and fruit while sitting where orchestra members usually perform. Déjà vu all over again, as Yogi Berra would say.

Anything in existence for 60 years deserves parties, and this has been designated as the Diamond Jubilee. President Don Marshall gave a roll call from the past, thanking many of those present since the early 1980's. Honored by this recognition were Barbara and Dick Sterling, Ruth Hillecke, Lea Fratello, Harold Tseklenis, and your truly. And Elizabeth Wilson, it turned out, has been here since the beginning, in 1958.

Elections took place recently for officers for 2019-20, and the present Board will serve again: Don Marshall as President; Carol Kearns, Vice President; Ruth Hillecke as Secretary; and Bill Hare Treasurer.

What do classical music aficianados listen to, when it's not Mozart or Mahler? For this occasion, it was soft jazz by Three's Company that greeted guests as they entered the room. Later patrons would

be entertained by country and western songs as played and sung by Steve Roberson and his composing buddies Paul Marshall, who came all the way from Topanga, and guitarist and singer Karen Tobin.

Three's Company featured Lars Clutterham on piano, with Bill Hare at the drums setting the beat. The symphony orchestra's principal double bass player Mark Artusio, the third member, appeared to be strumming a

So I thought, but professional musician Paul knew better. Even though he was sitting in a far corner of the room, Paul could see it was an electronic double bass. The long neck was the giveaway. Though less glamorous than an upright big fiddle, with its gleaming mellow wood, the electronic model must be easier to bring to a party to perform.

"This trio came together specifically to celebrate the Downey Symphony's 60th anniversary" said Lars, "so our two performances—one at the beginning and one at the end of this yearlong celebration—will be the extent of our playing together."

"Incidentally" said Lars, "the bass is performed almost exclusively "pizzicato" - that is, plucked without a bow--as part of the soft jazz style. And drums are generally performed with brushes rather than sticks, for a softer non-military sound. Piano is normally responsible for the melody and for filling out the

With Lars on piano to lead the way, the trio played easy listening songs from 1958, top pop tunes from the year the Downey Symphony was founded, by Buddy Holly, Pat Boone and Perry Como, The Kingston Trio too.

Lars is resident composer for the Downey Symphony Orchestra, and has given us several original compositions, notably The Arc of My Life performed in January for this

commemorative year.

"For today's performance" said Lars, "since jazz is fundamentally improvisator, all three of us will be making up what we're playing, within the constraints of the basic harmonies and melodies of the tunes we're playing." The Sound of Music never sounded better.

'What's your contribution here?" I asked Board and Guild member Cindy Kovach, who was stationed at the door to the banquet room that decorated with many-colored balloons, thanks to Celia Santana.

"I'm on Joyce's team, and Joyce told me to get here early and hand out programs," said Cindy, the manager of US Bank in Downey. "It's good to be on Joyce's team. We spent weeks planning this day, and I do whatever Joyce says.'

Other members besides Joyce Sherwin who were on the 60th Anniversary Planning Committee included Katie Hare, Mark Keller, Don Marshall and Mary Stevens.

Seen at tables around the room: sitting with long-time member Harold Tseklenis and wife Anna, were board member Ryan Keene and wife Jessica, chatting with entertainer Steve Roberson. Karol and Hop Morrison made their way around the silent auction tables, as did Carol and Frank Kearns, and Joanne Gronley. Dorothy Pemberton arrived in plenty of time to enjoy the music.

"Is Ryan a new Symphony Board member?" asked Steve. 'Yes," I replied, "and he's also a new member of Rotary.

"I won't hold that against him," said Steve, a past president and stalwart of Downey Los Amigos Kiwanis.





Downey Unified celebrates its high school graduates

DOWNEY - The last week of May was very busy for all Downey Unified high school students, teachers and administrators. With commencement ceremonies quickly approaching; many students made the final touches on what would be their last week of high school.

A total of 1,004 seniors showed nothing put passion and enthusiasm as they accepted their diplomas; 15 of these Vikings finished the 2018-19 school year with a 4.5 GPA or

Cheering on the graduates were approximately 11,000 supporters.

Sealbearers are recognized as students in the state of California who possess high standards in academic scholarship, community service and citizenship. Downey and Warren high schools honored a total of 235 Sealbearers in this year's graduating class.

Overall, 629 students that are graduating from Downey Unified will be attending a myriad of Ivy League schools or four-year universities in the fall including Cornell, Harvard, Pepperdine, Georgetown, University of Pennsylvania, Concordia, Stanford, Biola, Brown, Loyola Marymount, Cal Baptist, University of Chicago, Vanguard, Sacramento State, UCLA, USC, UC Berkeley, UC Davis, UC Santa Barbara and UC Irvine. Additional graduates will be attending a number of





"With a combined graduating total of 1,977 students,



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
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
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
